
CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS

WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in June 2010. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased 34 percent compared to the number received in June 2009. June 2010 approvals decreased by 5 percent, denials decreased by 39 percent, and pending decreased less than 30% compared to June 2009.

Applications for Benefits: Received, Approved, and Pending

- Major receipt volumes in June 2010 include: 135,302 I-765 employment authorizations; 61,956 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 60,561 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 51,154 I-485 applications to adjust status; 37,116 I-131 travel document/advance parole; 33,265 I-129 forms filed; 32,155 I-821 temporary protected status.
- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of June 2010 include: 536,945 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 396,458 I-485 applications to adjust status; 213,401 I-765 employment authorizations; 171,699 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 66,545 I-129 forms filed; 61,658 I-131 travel document/advance parole; 59,094 I-821 temporary protected status; 56,745 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive.

¹ The Performance Analysis System (PAS) is the USCIS System of Record for capturing and reporting field office and service center performance data. The G-22.2 is the PAS data entry worksheet used to collect monthly Immigration Application statistics.
