CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS

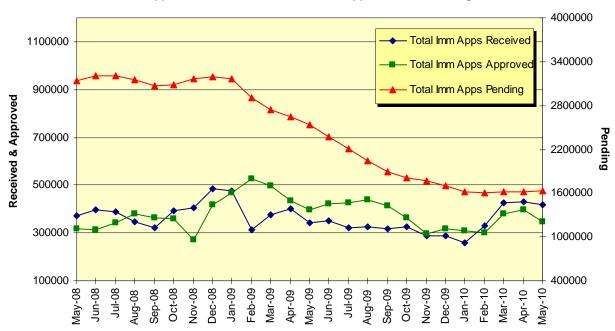
WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in May 2010. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased 21percent compared to the number received in May 2009. May 2010 approvals decreased by 13 percent, denials decreased by 40 percent, and pending decreased less than 36% compared to May 2009.

- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of May 2010 include: 568,909 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 395,222 I-485 applications to adjust status; 184,924 I-765 employment authorizations; 163,757 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 61,361 I-129 forms filed; 58,845 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive.
