CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS

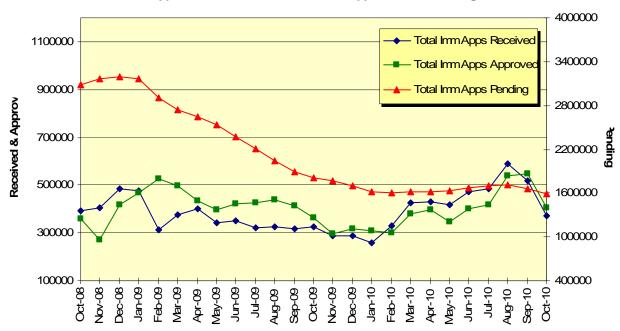
WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in October 2010. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased 15 percent compared to the number received in October 2009. October 2010 approvals increased by 12 percent, denials decreased by 20 percent, and pending decreased less than 12% compared to October 2009.

- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of October 2010 include: 425,740 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 387,294 I-485 applications to adjust status; 182,441 I-765 employment authorizations; 174,310 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 79,184 I-129 forms filed; 73,651 I-131 travel document/advance; 66,578 I-821 temporary protected status.
