CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in April 2012. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased 7 percent compared to the number received in April 2011. April 2012 approvals increased by 74 percent, denials decreased by 20 percent, and pending increased by 14% compared to April 2011.
