CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in January 2012. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased 55 percent compared to the number received in January 2011. January 2012 approvals increased by 21 percent, denials decreased by 3 percent, and pending increased by 27% compared to January 2011.
