CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in April 2010. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased 6 percent compared to the number received in April 2009. April 2010 approvals decreased by 9 percent, denials decreased by 33 percent, and pending decreased less than 39% compared to April 2009.

- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of April 2010 include: 602,499 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 397,371 I-485 applications to adjust status; 156,068 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 155,542 I-765 employment authorizations; 59,487 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive; 56,001 I-129 forms filed.
