
CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS

WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in February 2010. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased 5 percent compared to the number received in February 2009. February 2010 approvals decreased by 43 percent, denials decreased by 19 percent, and pending decreased less than 45% compared to February 2009.

Applications for Benefits: Received, Approved, and Pending

- Major receipt volumes in February 2010 include: 78,035 I-765 employment authorizations; 52,529 green card renewals/replacements; 47,752 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 35,288 I-485 applications to adjust status; 25,711 I-131 reentry permit/refugee travel document and advance parole.
- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of February 2010 include: 671,898 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 395,680 I-485 applications to adjust status; 142,331 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 123,869 I-765 employment authorizations; 64,854 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive; 39,726 I-131 reentry permit/refugee travel document and advance parole.

¹ The Performance Analysis System (PAS) is the USCIS System of Record for capturing and reporting field office and service center performance data. The G-22.2 is the PAS data entry worksheet used to collect monthly Immigration Application statistics.
