CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in May 2011. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts decreased 7 percent compared to the number received in May 2010. May 2011 approvals increased by 5 percent, denials decreased by 18 percent, and pending increased less than 2% compared to May 2010.

- Major receipt volumes in May 2011 include: 78,789 I-765 employment authorizations; 71,641 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 61,773 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 47,721 I-485 applications to adjust status; 34,788 I-129 forms filed; 29,150 I-131 travel document/advance parole.
- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of May 2011 include: 495,309 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 388,680 I-485 applications to adjust status; 258,902 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 148,560 I-765 employment authorizations; 87,361 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive; 64,451 I-131 travel document/advance parole; 56,228 I-129 forms filed.
