STAFF ACCOUNTING BULLETIN NO. 96

Staff Accounting Bulletin No. 96 sets forth the staff's interpretation of generally accepted accounting principles with respect to the effect of treasury stock acquisitions following consummation of a business combination accounted for as a pooling-of-interests. This staff accounting bulletin has been published because the staff has noted inconsistencies in the interpretations made by registrants and their auditors of the applicable accounting literature and earlier Commission guidance in this area. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

GARY WILLIKY, FORMER PRINCIPAL OF CHELSEA STREET SECURITIES, INC., BARRED AND JAMES ROMANO, VICE PRESIDENT OF SALES, BARRED WITH THE RIGHT TO REAPPLY AFTER FOUR YEARS IN PENNY STOCK CASE

On March 18, the Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Gary Steven Williky (Williky), formerly a registered principal and chairman of the board of Chelsea Street Securities, Inc., (Chelsea), a now defunct broker-dealer, and James John Romano (Romano), formerly a vice president of sales and shareholder of Chelsea. Williky consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, except the entry of a permanent injunction against him which he admits. The Order bars Williky from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer. Romano consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, except the entry of a permanent injunction against him which he admits. The Order bars Romano from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer with the right to reapply after a period of four years.

The Order finds that Williky and Romano, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint against them, consented to the entry of injunctions in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas (Dallas Division) [<u>SEC v.</u> <u>Gary Steven Williky and James John Romano</u>] permanently enjoining them from violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Commission's complaint alleged that Williky and Romano engaged in the fraudulent offer and sale of the securities of four speculative companies through Chelsea, and engaged in undisclosed manipulative sales practices, including "matched" trading and "wash" purchase and sales transactions. PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST SAGE TECHNOLOGY, INC.

The Commission announced that on March 11 the Honorable Horace T. Ward, United States District Judge for the Northern District of Georgia, entered an order of permanent injunction against Sage Technology, Inc. (Sage) of Smyrna, Georgia, Jamie Edelkind of Kennesaw, Georgia, and William R. Thiele of Atlanta, Georgia, enjoining them from further violations of the antifraud and broker registration provisions of the federal securities laws. The Defendants are further ordered to pay disgorgement in an amount to be set by the Court upon subsequent motion, pay civil penalties in an amount to be set by the Court, and file an accounting of all funds received in connection with the sale of Sage notes. The Defendants consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. The complaint alleges that the defendants have been conducting an offering of \$2 million in interest bearing notes issued by Sage. In connection with that offering, the defendants are alleged to have misrepresented Sage's assets, failed to disclose that Sage was already in default on interest payments due to previous purchasers of its notes, and misrepresented the educational accomplishments of Edelkind, who was represented, falsely, to have earned a Ph.D. [SEC v. Sage Technology, Inc., USDC, ND GA., Civil Action No. 1 96-CV-361-HTW] (LR-14846)

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST JOHN AND LINDA CANKOVICH

The Commission filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against John and Linda Dankovich, residents of Miramar, Florida. The complaint alleges that the Dankoviches pretended to be securities brokers and in telephone solicitations offered to sell specific securities to investors at a According to the complaint, however, the Dankoviches discount. actually used the approximately \$44,000 they obtained from investors for their own personal expenses. The complaint also alleges that John Dankovich separately caused a brokerage firm to purchase securities for which he never intended to pay. The complaint charges both Dankoviches with violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Sections 10(b), 15(a) and 15(c) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rules 10b-5, 15b1-1 and 15c1-2 thereunder, and John Dankovich with also violating Sections 7(f) of the Exchange Act and Regulation X promulgated by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System in connection with these activities. Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, the Dankoviches, without admitting or denying any of the allegations in the complaint, consented to the entry of an order enjoining them from future violations of those provisions, and requiring them to pay \$51,653, an amount representing the disgorgement of their illegal profits plus prejudgment interest. The Dankoviches also agreed to settle a related administrative proceeding by consenting to the issuance of a Commission order barring them from association with any broker, dealer, investment advisor, investment company or municipal securities dealer. COMMISSION SEEKS TO COMPEL PARALLEL TECHNOLOGIES, INC. TO FILE DELINQUENT PERIODIC REPORTS

On March 19, the Commission filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against Parallel Technologies, Inc. (Parallel) of Yonkers, New York. The complaint alleges that Parallel a publicly-owned computer software company failed to make available to the investing public current and accurate information about its financial condition and results of operation through the filing of periodic reports with the Commission as required by the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act). Specifically, the complaint alleges that Parallel has not filed its Annual Report on Form 10-K for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1994, three Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarters ended March 31, June 30 and September 30, 1995 and three Notifications of Late Filing with respect to its delinquent reports. The Commission seeks to compel Parallel to file its delinquent periodic reports and to enjoin Parallel from further violations of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 12b-25, 13a-1 and 13a-13, thereunder. INSIDER TRADING ACTION FILED AGAINST MICHAEL ANGELOS AND G. GREGORY RUSSELL

The Commission filed an insider trading action today against two former officers of the Maryland Port Administration alleging improper tipping and trading in the securities of Baltimore Bancorp shortly before a January 13, 1994 announcement that Baltimore Bancorp was discussing a possible business combination with several financial institutions.

The Commission's suit, filed in the United States District Court for the District of Maryland, Northern Division, alleges that the defendants violated Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. Simultaneously with the commencement of the action, defendant Michael P. Angelos consented, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint, to the entry of a final judgment permanently enjoining him from violating Section 10(b) and Rule 10b-5. Angelos agreed to pay \$61,762.83, representing disgorgement of \$36,650, prejudgment interest of \$6,787.83 and a civil penalty of \$18,325. Defendant G. Gregory Russell has not settled the action. [SEC v. Michael P. Angelos and G. Gregory Russell, Civil Action No. B96-834, D. Md.] (LR-14850)

NATIONAL INTEGRITY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 12 to request a hearing on an application filed by National Integrity Life Insurance Company (National Integrity), Separate Account I of National Integrity Life Insurance Company (Separate Account I), Separate Account II of National Integrity Life Insurance Company (Separate Account II, and together with Separate Account I, Separate Accounts) and SBM Financial Services, Inc. (SBM) (collectively, Investment Company Act granting exemptions from Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) Act to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of the Separate Accounts or other separate accounts established by National Integrity (Other Separate Accounts) to support certain flexible premium variable annuity contracts (Contracts) as well as other variable annuity contracts that are substantially similar in all material respects to the Contracts (Future Contracts). In addition, Applicants request that such exemptive relief extend to any brokerdealer other than SBM which may serve in the future as principal underwriter in respect of the Contracts or of Future Contracts offered by National Integrity and made available through the Separate Accounts or the Other Separate Accounts. IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Depository Trust Company filed a proposed rule change (SR-Philadep-96-05) which became effective upon filing. The proposed rule change makes a technical correction to renumber Philadep's rule regarding the release of clearing data from Rule 32 to Rule 33. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal</u> <u>Register</u> during the week of March 18. (Rel. 34-36972)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change (SR-PSE-95-28) filed by the <u>Pacific Stock Exchange</u> which amends PSE Rule 7.6, "Position Limits for Index Options," to establish a hedge exemption from industry (narrow-based) index option position limits. Publication of the approval order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 18. (Rel. 34-36981) The <u>Midwest Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-MCC-96-03) relating to pass-through of certain fees and charges assessed on MCC by the National Securities Clearing Corporation and the elimination of all other charges by MCC. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 25. (Rel. 34-36982)

The <u>Options Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-96-01) that will change the choice of law provisions and other provisions in OCC's by-laws and rules in connection with Illinois' adoption of the 1994 amendments to Articles 8 and 9 of the Uniform Commercial Code.
