ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

INITIAL DECISION IN THE MATTER OF ALAN ROSENTHAL

An administrative law judge has found it to be in the public interest to bar Alan E. Rosenthal from being associated with a broker or dealer or from participating in an offering of penny stock. In June 1992, a jury convicted Mr. Rosenthal, who had headed the Convertible Bond Department at Drexel Burnham Lambert Inc., of offering a gratuity to David Solomon in violation of 18 U.S.C § 1954. Mr. Solomon controlled Solomon Asset Management, a registered investment adviser, which managed \$2.5 billion in pension funds and which did considerable business with Drexel. As the result of his felony conviction, Mr. Rosenthal received a one-year sentence that was suspended, was fined \$250,000, was ordered to perform 300 hours of community service, and was placed on probation for three years. Although an appellate court affirmed Mr. Rosenthal's conviction, in the administrative proceeding, he did not acknowledge wrongdoing or give any assurance that he would not commit future violations, but he continued to claim that he "engaged in lawful securities transactions all conducted in accordance with ordinary industry (Initial Decision No. 91) practice."

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST MICHAEL EBERLE, ET AL.

The Commission announced the issuance of an order instituting public administrative proceedings pursuant to Sections 15(b)(6) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Order alleges that on March 16, 1995, a U.S. District Court permanently enjoined Eberle, Hodge, Costello, Gilliland, VanEcho and Williamson (Respondents) from future violations of certain antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Order further alleges that the Respondents willfully violated those provisions in their offer and

sale of over \$1.3 million worth of Reitz Data Communications, Inc., common stock, and that the Respondents sold these shares to the public at artificially inflated and manipulated prices, and at prices which included excessive undisclosed markups. A public hearing will be held to determine whether the allegations against the Respondents are true, to offer them an opportunity to establish any defenses to such allegations and to determine what remedial action, if any, is appropriate. Finally, the Order alleges that on February 9, 1996, an Ohio state court sentenced Hodge to 5 1/2 to 25 years in prison and fined him \$10,000 based upon a jury convicting him of engaging in a pattern of corrupt activity and theft in connection with the offer and sale of stock. CONTEMPT ORDER ENTERED AGAINST GERARD SPATARO

The Commission announced that on June 7 the Honorable David C. Bramlette III, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of Mississippi, entered an order holding Gerard A. Spataro (Spataro) in contempt for failing to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$63,000 plus prejudgment interest as previously ordered by the Court on June 17, 1994. In response to the Commission's motion for an order to show cause why Spataro should not be held in contempt for failure to pay the disgorgement, the Court entered an order on December 22, 1994, directing Spataro to show cause in writing, no later than January 3, 1995, why the Court should not hold him in contempt for non-payment of the disgorgement. Spataro did not respond to the Court order nor did he pay the money.

The Commission's complaint, filed on March 10, 1993, alleged that, from January 1990 to May 1991, Spataro mislead investors by representing to the investors that Spataro and others had obtained agreements with the Peruvian government and at least two international banks to encash or purchase 1875 Peruvian bonds. No such agreements existed. The bonds were considered worthless by the Peruvian government; a fact which Spataro knew. [SEC v. Alvis B. Rutland, Scofield Berthelot, William D. Cornett, Howard W. SETTLEMENT OF INSIDER TRADING CHARGES AGAINST JOHN O'BRIEN

On June 11, the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against John O'Brien for violations of the federal securities laws in connection with his trading in three AT&T acquisition targets -- NCR Corporation, Digital Microwave Corporation, and Teradata Corporation -- while in possession of material, non-public information. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, filed on October 31, 1995, O'Brien consented to the entry of an injunction, disgorgement of his profits of \$24,674.63, plus prejudgment interest. In light of Mr. O'Brien's cooperation and under the circumstances of this case, a penalty was not imposed.

The Commission's complaint alleges that O'Brien traded while in possession of material, non-public information about the three planned acquisitions that he received from Thomas Alger (an AT&T insider) who, in turn, received the information from Charles Brumfield (at the time a Vice President in AT&T's Human Resources Department).

Litigation with respect to the remaining defendants is continuing. [SEC v. Brumfield, et al., Civ. Action No. 95-9283, JES, SDNY] (LR-14956)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

BANKERS TRUST AUSTRALIA LIMITED

An order has been issued on an application filed by Bankers Trust Australia Limited (BTAL) under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act for an exemption from Section 17(f) of the Act. The order permits BTAL to maintain foreign securities and other assets of U.S. registered investment companies in the custody of Pendal Nominees Pty. Limited, an indirect, wholly-owned subsidiary of BTAL. (Rel. IC-22030; IS-996 - June 19)

WASHINGTON NATIONAL INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Washington National Insurance Company (Washington National) and Separate Account I of Washington National Insurance Company (Separate Account), which will be reorganized from a managed separate account to a separate account organized as a unit investment trust (Continuing Separate Account), from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act. The order provides exemptions to the extent necessary to permit Washington National to deduct a mortality risk charge from the Continuing Separate Account. (Rel. IC-22031 - June 19)

COMMONWEALTH BANK OF AUSTRALIA

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 15 to request a hearing on an application filed by Commonwealth Bank of Australia (CBA) for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting an exemption from Section 17(f) of the Act. The order would permit registered investment companies for which CBA serves as custodian or subcustodian to maintain foreign securities and other assets in Australia with CBA Nominees Limited, a whollyowned subsidiary of CBA. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed a notice of proposed rule change (SR-NASD-95-40) that would allow the NASD to amend Schedule I to the NASD By-Laws (PORTAL Rules) to establish a pilot for one year for the reporting of the initial placement (primary transactions) and secondary transactions in securities designated in the PORTAL Market as PORTAL securities.

Consistent with the recent reorganization of the NASD Manual, The PORTAL Market Rules that were set forth in Schedule I to the NASD By-Laws are now set forth in the Rule 5300 series of the Market Rules. (Rel. 34-37317)

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-PHLX-96-20) to adopt new Floor Procedure Advice (Advice) F-26, "Equity Options Contrary Exercise Advices," which will add certain provisions of paragraph (b), "Exercise Cut-Off for Expiring Options," of PHLX Rule 1042, "Exercise of Equity Option Contracts," to the PHLX's Floor Procedure Advice Handbook. The PHLX proposes to include Advice F-26 in the Exchange's minor rule violation enforcement and reporting plan. Publication of the notice is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 24. (Rel. 34-37322)

The <u>National Securities Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-96-10) relating to modifications to NSCC's rules to enable NSCC members using the Fund/Serv system to establish a settlement cycle for a mutual fund transaction other than that which would be automatically assigned by Fund/Serv. Publication is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 24. (Rel. 34-37341)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change (SR-Phlx-96-03) and Amendment No. 2 thereto by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> to revise the composition of the Phlx Gold/Silver Index by adding two underlying stocks and to adopt procedures to address replacements, additions and deletions of component stocks. Publication of the approval order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 24. (Rel. 34-37334)

PARTIAL APPROVAL OF A PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved the portion of a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-95-35) filed by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> which amends Amex Rule 900(a), "Applicability," to confirm the Amex's enforcement authority over Amex members' options transaction effected on another options exchange. Publication of the partial approval order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 24. (Rel. 34-37328)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Chicago Board Options Exchange</u> to amend and establish certain fees relating to a replacement pager system (SR-CBOE-96-34) has become effective. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 24. (Rel. 34-37342)
