DIPLOMATIC NOTES EXCHANGED BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND SWITZERLAND

On November 3, 1993, the United States and Switzerland exchanged diplomatic notes relating to the Treaty between the United States and Switzerland on Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters. The notes expand the scope of available mutual legal assistance between the Securities and Exchange Commission and the Swiss authorities. (International Series Rel. 626)

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

FORMER HEAD MUNICIPAL SECURITIES TRADER OF ARKANSAS BOND DEALER BARRED

The Commission has settled administrative proceedings against Jimmy Dale Swink, Jr. (Swink), formerly head municipal securities trader of Swink & Co., Inc. (Swink & Co.), a now-defunct broker-dealer. Swink consented to the issuance of an order barring him from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer. The bar is based on an criminal conviction in United States District Court for the Eastern District of Arkansas (United States of America v. Jimmy D. Swink, Jr., LR-CR-92-158(2)). The Order provides that the bar will be vacated, upon Swink's application, if the conviction is reversed or vacated on appeal. Swink was convicted of conspiracy to violate securities law and perjury and sentenced to five months imprisonment, to be served in a halfway house, and supervised release for a term of 36 months. FORMER PRESIDENT OF ARKANSAS BOND DEALER BARRED

The Commission has settled administrative proceedings against Jimmy Dale Swink, Sr. (Swink), formerly president, chairman of the board, and majority shareholder and control person of Swink & Co., Inc. (Swink & Co.), a now-defunct broker-dealer. Swink consented to the issuance of an order barring him from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company or municipal securities dealer. The bar is based on an criminal conviction in United States District Court for the Eastern District of Arkansas (United States of America v. Jimmy D. Swink, Sr., LR-CR-92-158(1)). Swink pled guilty to willfully causing month-end reports required to be created and maintained by Swink & Co. to be false and incorrect. Swink was sentenced to 21 months in prison, and thereafter, supervised release for 48 months and fined \$5,000. (Rel. 34-33399)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CROWN AMERICA SEPARATE ACCOUNT B

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Crown America Separate Account B (Applicant) for an order under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that the Applicant has ceased to be an investment company. LINCOLN RENAISSANCE FUNDS, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Lincoln Renaissance Fund, Inc., et al. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act that would exempt applicants from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f)(1), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c), and 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The order would permit certain investment companies to issue multiple classes of shares representing interests in the same portfolio of securities and assess and, under certain circumstances, waive a contingent deferred sales charge on redemptions of shares. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

WEST TEXAS UTILITIES COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing West Texas Utilities Company (West Texas), a wholly owned electric public-utility subsidiary company of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, to sell a natural gas pipeline and related facilities (Pipeline) to Transok, Inc. (Transok), an affiliate of West Texas, for \$4,125,605. West Texas then intends to lease the Pipeline from Transok. (Rel. 35-25968)

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 24 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Southern Company (Southern), a registered holding company. Southern proposes to effect a stock split in the form of a stock distribution at any time on or prior to December 31, 1995. Southern proposes to issue and distribute to the holders of record of the then outstanding shares of common stock up to one additional share of such stock for each share held at such time. The proposed stock split would be effected pursuant to authorization by the Board of Directors of Southern at such time as the Board considers the same to be desireable and in the best interests of Southern and its stockholders. The par value of the shares of common stock, \$5.00 per share, will not be affected by the proposed stock split. (Rel. 35-25969)

NEWPORT ELECTRIC CORPORATION

A supplemental order has been issued correcting the Commission's order dated December 29, 1993 (HCAR No. 25967) authorizing Newport Electric Corporation (Newport), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Eastern Utilities Associates, a registered holding company, to refinance \$7,925,000 aggregate amount of outstanding tax-exempt bonds. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PARTIAL ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>Chicago Board Options Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-93-60) to extend until December 31, 1994, a pilot program that allows approved public customers with qualified portfolios to effect and maintain in cash accounts debit put spread transactions in broad-based index options with European-style exercise. In addition, the CBOE seeks permanent approval of the pilot program. The Commission granted accelerated approval to the portion of the proposal which extends the pilot program through December 31, 1994. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal</u> Register during the week of January 3. (Rel. 34-33404)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change (SR-PSE-93-17) granting permanent approval to the PSE's Options Trading Crowd Performance Evaluation pilot program. Under the evaluation program, the PSE's Options Allocation Committee conducts quarterly evaluations of options trading crowds to determine whether they have fulfilled performance standards relating to quality of markets, competition among market makers, observance of ethical standards, and administrative requirements. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of January 3. (Rel. 34-33407)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> (SR-PHLX-93-63) relating to an extension of the effectiveness of its pilot program and accompanying rules regarding the trading of Nasdaq/National Market System securities through December 31, 1994.
