ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

THOMAS EGAN BARRED

The Securities and Exchange Commission announced the entry of an Order Instituting Public Administrative Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Thomas M. Egan (Egan), former president and chief executive officer of Stotler Group, Inc. (SGI) and Stotler and Company, a corporation, and managing partner of Stotler and Company, an Illinois partnership.

Egan consented to the issuance of the Order without admitting or denying the Commission's findings. The Order, which permanently barred Egan from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser, or municipal or government securities broker or dealer, contained findings that on from August 1988 to August 1990, Egan violated and/or aided and abetted violations of the antifraud, brokerdealer registration, books and records, net capital, customer protection, proxy and reporting provisions of the federal securities laws and that Egan was permanently enjoined from future violations of the above provisions of the federal securities laws. Specifically, the Order finds that Egan participated in a scheme to defraud public investors and to deceive the Commission and other regulatory agencies concerning the financial condition of SGI and its subsidiaries. This scheme involved a series of transactions which were structured to conceal self-dealing, create the false appearance of regulatory capital compliance and profitability and misrepresent SGI's true financial condition. IN THE MATTER OF THE TRAVELERS CORPORATION, THE TRAVELERS INSURANCE COMPANY, THOMAS THORSEN AND STEPHEN WILLCOX

The Securities and Exchange Commission today announced that The Travelers Corporation (Travelers), The Travelers Insurance Company (Travelers Insurance), Thomas O. Thorsen (Thorsen), formerly Travelers' chief financial officer, and Stephen L. Willcox (Willcox), formerly Travelers' vice president of corporate financial planning, consented, without admitting or denying the matters set forth in the order, to the entry of an order pursuant to Section 21C of the Securities Exchange Act directing Travelers Insurance, Thorsen and Willcox to cease and desist from violating or causing violations of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 12b-20, 13a-1 and 13a-13.

The order also requires Travelers and Travelers Insurance to restate their consolidated financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 1989 in order to implement properly FAS 97, "Accounting and Reporting by Insurance Enterprises for Certain Long Duration Contracts and for Realized Gains and Losses from the Sale of Investments" issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board, and to take charges to 1989 pre-tax earnings for other than temporary impairments in their real estate and mortgage loan portfolio for that year.

In the order, the Commission found, among other things, that Travelers and Travelers Insurance filed with the Commission periodic reports in 1989 that contained financial statements that did not correctly implement FAS 97. Had Travelers and Travelers Insurance properly implemented FAS 97, their 1989 pre-tax incomes would have been \$231 million less than reported. (Rel. 34-33995)

NORMAN BROOKS AND JAMES BROOKS INDICTED FOR SECURITIES FRAUD AND PERJURY

On May 4, a federal grand jury in New Hampshire charged Norman L. Brooks (Brooks) and James Brooks in an eleven count indictment containing allegations of securities fraud, wire fraud and conspiracy to commit wire and mail fraud and other related charges. James Brooks was also indicted for perjury for statements made in connection with a related civil action brought by the Commission against Brooks, James Brooks and others for various violations of the federal securities laws.

The Commission's related action, filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of New Hampshire on April 5, alleged that the defendants engaged in a fraudulent boiler-room offering of unregistered securities, in the form of promissory notes, that raised more than \$3.5 million from more than 100 investors in 25 states. On April 18, the Court issued a temporary restraining Order against all of the defendants. In doing so, the Court found that the Defendants fraudulently misrepresented that the proceeds of their securities sales would be used to make automobile loans when, in fact, only \$850,000 was used for that purpose and the remaining \$2.65 million was used personally by the defendants, paid to the defendants' counsel, or cannot be found. ZZZZ BEST CONSULTANT MAURICE RIND ENJOINED

On April 28, 1994, Judge Harry L. Hupp of the Central District of California entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Disgorgement against Maurice Rind enjoining Rind from violations of the antifraud provisions of Securities Act Section 17(a) and Exchange Act Section 10(b) and Rule 10b-5, and the issuer reporting and recordkeeping provisions of Section 13(a) and 13(b)(2) of the Exchange Act and Rules 12b-20,13a-13, 13b2-1, and ordering Rind to disgorge \$720,000 together with prejudgment interest. Payment was waived, however, based upon Rind's demonstrated inability to pay. Rind consented to entry of the Judgment without admitting or denying allegations.

The Commission alleged that Rind caused misrepresentations in financial statements included in October 1986 Form S-1 registration statements filed with the Commission by ZZZ Best Co., Inc. The financial statements represent that Z Best purchased twenty-two used electrical generators for \$1.97 million from an unrelated company in its fiscal year 1986, when in fact the generators were not purchased in fiscal year 1986, resulting in a 64% overstatement of Z Best's assets; they were purchased for approximately \$580,000; and they were purchased from a related company. The statements also fail to disclose that Rind received \$720,000 from Z Best for his role in purchasing the generators. [SEC v. Maurice Rind, Civil Action No. 90-4361 HLH, C.D. Cal.] (LR-14075)

HOLDING COMPANY

PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

An order has been issued authorizing Public Service Company of New Hampshire, a public-utility subsidiary company of Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, to issue and sell, through May 14, 1996, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$125 million of notes under terms and conditions established in a revolving credit agreement.
