CHAIRMAN LEVITT TO TESTIFY

NOTIFICATION OF DELETION OF PRIVACY ACT SYSTEMS OF RECORDS

In accordance with the Privacy Act of 1974, 5 U.S.C. 552a, the Securities and Exchange Commission is deleting seven records systems that are either obsolete or were replaced by another existing system; and altering the notices of forty-three existing systems of records to reflect revisions to the agency's address, records retention and disposal schedule, notification procedures and record access procedures, updating the names of records systems, and designating new system managers. EDGAR PHASE-IN LIST UPDATES AVAILABLE TO PUBLIC

Pursuant to Rule 901 of Regulation S-T, registrants whose filings are processed by the Division of Corporation Finance may request a change in the date they become subject to mandated electronic filing on the Electronic Data Gathering, Analysis, and Retrieval (EDGAR) system. The Division intends to publish from time to time changes and corrections to the phase-in list published in the <u>Federal Register</u> on March 18, 1993 (Release No. 33-6977 (February 23, 1993) [58 FR 14628]). A change to a company's phase-in date is of particular importance to persons or entities filing documents with respect to that company, since generally such persons must file electronically when the company become subject to electronic filing.

The updates will be published in the SEC News Digest and copies of the phase-in list updates will be available through the Commission's public reference room. They also will be posted on the EDGAR electronic bulletin board.

In addition, the Division has placed in the public reference room a copy of the phase-in list as of February 23, 1993, with companies sorted by group number. This information was published in the <u>Federal Register</u> on March 18, 1993, with all companies being listed in alphabetical order rather than sorted by group number. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

INITIAL DECISION SUSPENDS CPA ROBERT POTTS FROM APPEARING AND PRACTICING BEFORE THE COMMISSION FOR EIGHTEEN MONTHS

Administrative Law Judge Edward J. Kuhlmann has issued an initial decision suspending Robert D. Potts from appearing and practicing before the Commission for eighteen months. Potts is a certified public accountant licensed to practice in the State of Minnesota. During 1988, 1989, and 1990 Potts was an accountant with the accounting firms of Touche Ross & Co. and Deloitte & Touche and was the concurring partner for the fiscal year 1988 and 1989 audits of Kahler Corporation. In both 1988 and 1989, Potts signed documents indicating that he had reviewed Kahler's financial statements and the audits of them, and concluded that they satisfied the standards of the profession.

Kahler's consolidated financial statements for those years were included in filings made with the Commission. Judge Kuhlmann found that the audits were not conducted in accordance with GAAS and the financial statements were not fairly presented in accordance with GAAP. Potts' failure to act as a reasonable concurring partner contributed to the fact that the 1988 and 1989 audits were not performed in accordance with GAAS. Judge Kuhlmann found that Potts engaged in improper professional conduct in violation of Rule of Practice 2(e). (Initial Decision No. 48)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST FIFTEEN FORMER F.D. ROBERTS AFFILIATES

The Commission instituted administrative proceedings against Frederick Galiardo, John Perfetti, Alan Lieb, Morton Greenberg, Albert Weiss, Lawrence Diodato, Pamella Rutherford, Ronald Lieberman, Michael Recchia, John Conte, Kevin Zacharewicz, Jonathan Lendrum, Robert Eli Gregg, John Montondo and Joseph Muscolina (Respondents). The Respondents were former officers, directors, managers and/or registered representatives of F.D. Roberts Securities, Inc. (F.D. Roberts), a registered brokerdealer which ceased operations in February 1989. The Order Instituting Proceedings alleges that between September 1989 and October 1990, the Respondents pled guilty in the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey to an Indictment or an Information based on their securities violations in a massive manipulation scheme while affiliated with F.D. Roberts. (Rel. 34-34072)

IN THE MATTER OF BARRY POMERANTZ AND THEODORE WENGROFSKY

The Commission announced the settlement of administrative cease-and-desist proceedings against Barry Pomerantz and Theodore Wengrofsky. The proceedings, instituted pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act, were based on allegations that respondents Pomerantz and Wengrofsky committed or caused violations of Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act. The Commission's order found that in 1989, Pomerantz and Wengrofsky acquired from the chairman of the now-defunct Gil-Med Industries, Inc. (Gil-Med) 125,000 shares of Gil-Med common stock and sold them, without registration, to the public. The Commission has ordered that the respondents cease and desist from committing or causing violations or future violations of Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act. (Rel. 33-7061)

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST JAMES DONOHUE INDIVIDUALLY AND D/B/A GOLD COAST MANAGEMENT AND GOLD COAST CAPITAL

The Commission announced the filing of a civil injunctive action in the Southern District of Florida against James L. Donohue (Donohue). The action seeks permanent injunctive relief against future violations of the antifraud and other provisions of the federal securities laws and a civil penalty.

The complaint alleges that Donohue used custodial bank accounts controlled by Ronald Margolin to engage in a free-riding scheme from June 1991 until at least October 1991 whereby Donohue traded millions of dollars worth of securities without having the intent or ability to pay for the securities. In many instances, the complaint alleges, Donohue walked away from unprofitable trades, leaving his brokers to absorb his losses. According to the complaint, Donohue caused his brokers losses totalling over \$200,000. For further information, see SEC v. Margolin, et al., LR-13342, LR-13362, and LR-13396. [SEC v. James L. ORDER OF DISGORGEMENT AGAINST JEFFREY NAVIN AND BUS/LINE MEDIA, IMPOSITION OF CIVIL PENALTY AGAINST THE AMERICAN MUTUAL HOLDING CORP. AND DENNIS SANTIAGO, AND ASSESSMENT OF CIVIL PENALTIES AGAINST JEFFREY NAVIN AND MICHAEL SIMS

On April 18, the Commission announced that the District Court for the Northern District of California entered orders, which ordered that Jeffrey Navin (Navin) and Bus/Line Media (BLM) are jointly and severally liable for disgorgement of \$3,937,267, together with prejudgment interest, payment of which will be waived based upon their demonstrated financial inability to pay; noted the appropriateness of civil penalties against Navin, but did not assess a penalty due to his inability to pay; required The American Mutual Holding Corp. (American Mutual) and Dennis Santiago (Santiago) to pay a first-tier civil penalty

in the amount of \$25,000 each; and noted the appropriateness of civil penalties against Michael Sims (Sims), but did not assess a penalty due to his demonstrated financial inability to pay. All of the defendants consented to the entry of the Orders.

The Commission's complaint alleged Navin and BLM, directly, and indirectly through independent sales agents, offered and sold unregistered securities in a bus stop shelter investment program pursuant to a Ponzi-like scheme, raising roughly \$4.4 million. Additionally, the complaint alleged that American Mutual, Santiago and Sims, sold BLM's unregistered securities. All of the defendants previously consented to permanent injunctions prohibiting future violations of the federal securities laws. [SEC v. FINAL JUDGMENT ISSUED AGAINST KENNETH ANDERSON

The Commission announced that on May 14 Judge William G. Young of the U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts issued a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Kenneth L. Anderson (Anderson), a former over-the-counter (OTC) trader for Fidelity Capital Markets, a division of National Financial Services Corporation. Anderson, who consented to the Injunction without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, was enjoined from violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder.

The Commission's complaint alleges that, from February 1989 through October 1991, Anderson used the brokerage account of a friend to effect fraudulent trades of OTC securities, which generated \$83,385 of illicit profits. Specifically, the complaint alleges that Anderson, as an OTC trader, manually entered false trade execution reports at favorable prices without having contacted the market makers. When the trades failed to clear, Anderson persuaded the market makers to accept the trades by insisting that their records were in error.

Anderson had previously pled guilty to an information charging him with securities fraud for the same conduct as alleged in the Commission's complaint. Pursuant to the criminal action, Anderson paid full restitution and a \$14,000 fine. [SEC v. Kenneth L. Anderson, C.A. No. 10469WGY, USDC, D.MA] (LR-14096)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SECURITY EQUITY FUND, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 14 to request a hearing on an application filed by Security Equity Fund, et al. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act amending a previous order (Prior Order) that granted applicants relief from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c), and 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The Prior Order lets the applicants offer multiple classes of shares, assess a contingent deferred sales charge (CDSC) on certain redemptions of shares, and waive the CDSC in certain cases. The requested order would replace two of the waiver categories described in the Prior Order with more inclusive categories, and would permit the applicants to waive the CDSC in three additional cases. PRINCIPAL MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 14 to request a hearing on an application by Principal Mutual Life Insurance Company, Principal Mutual Life Insurance Company Separate Account B (Separate Account), and Princor Financial Services Corporation for an order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act. The order would provide exemptions to the extent necessary to permit the deduction from the assets of the Separate Account of a mortality and expense risks charge imposed under certain individual flexible purchase payment variable annuity contracts. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 13 to request a hearing on a proposal by General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, Jersey Central Power & Light Company, Metropolitan Edison Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company. GPU proposes to organize a subsidiary company to be known as GPU Generation Corporation (GPUGC) and acquire all of its common stock for \$50,000. In addition, GPU proposes to make open account advances to GPUGC from time to time up to an aggregate amount of \$1 million outstanding at any time. GPUGC proposes to undertake responsibility for the operation, maintenance and rehabilitation of all non-nuclear generation facilities owned and/or operated by the subsidiaries as well as the responsibility for the design, construction, start-up and testing of any new non-nuclear generation facilities which the subsidiaries may need in the future. HEC, INC.

A notice has been issued to provide all interested persons until June 13 to request a hearing on a proposal by HEC, Inc., a non-utility subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, under which it would form and finance two new non-utility subsidiaries -- HEC Energy Consulting Canada, Inc. and HEC International Corporation -- to consult and provide energy management and demand-side management services to utilities, government agencies and large energy consumers in Canada, the western United States, and foreign countries. CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORP., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 13 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central and South West Corporation (CSW), a registered holding company, and its nonutility subsidiary companies, CSW Energy, Inc. (Energy), CSW Development-I, Inc. (Energy Sub), and ARK/CSW Development Partnership (Joint Venture), for Energy Sub to acquire, for up to \$1,000, up to 100% of the common stock of Sacramento Power, Inc. (Project Venture), a Delaware corporation engaged in the development, construction, operation, and maintenance of the Sacramento Power Cogeneration Project (Project), a 148.5 megawatt gas-fired cogeneration facility or exempt wholesale generator to be located in or near Sacramento, California; for Energy to make capital contributions, open account advances, or loans downstream to Project Venture in an amount not to exceed \$15 million; for Joint Venture to join Project Venture in developing, constructing, operating, and maintaining the Project; for Project Venture to exercise an option to own and operate the Project; and for CSW, Energy, or the Joint Venture to obtain a letter of credit in an amount of up to \$2.9 million to secure the obligations of the Project Venture to develop the Project.
