ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

NASD ACTION AGAINST MARK ELLIOTT SUSTAINED

The Commission has sustained NASD disciplinary action against Mark Allen Elliott of Independence, Missouri, formerly a registered representative of Whitehouse & Moore Investments, Inc., and VSR Financial Services, Inc., which were members of the NASD. Elliott was censured, fined \$7,500, and suspended from association with any member firm for two years.

The Commission found that Elliott failed to respond properly to three requests by the NASD for information in connection with its investigation of a customer complaint. Sustaining the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission observed that "Elliott's failure to provide the requested information fully and promptly ... subverts the NASD's ability to carry out its regulatory responsibilities." NASD DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST JAMES BOWEN SUSTAINED

The Commission has sustained the NASD's finding of violation against James M. Bowen of Boulder, Colorado. The NASD censured Bowen and fined him \$1,500. The Commission found that Bowen failed to honor in a timely manner an arbitration award made against him. The award was issued against Bowen on December 28, 1990, and Bowen failed to pay it until March 23, 1992, one month after the NASD notified him that a complaint had been filed against him for his failure to pay the award.

The Commission rejected Bowen's argument that the National Business Conduct Committee improperly reversed the District Business Conduct Committee's finding that he was involved in good faith negotiations with the claimant's attorney. The Commission pointed out that Bowen's belief that he acted in good faith must be objectively reasonable and that Bowen failed to produce evidence of his continued good faith negotiations between himself and the claimant's attorney. NASD DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST STUART MILLS AND ROBERT PRISCO SUSTAINED AND AGAINST DAVID MUNTON AND DANIEL LEHL SUSTAINED IN PART

The Commission has sustained NASD disciplinary action against four registered representatives of a former member headquartered in Denver Colorado, First Choice Securities, Inc. The representatives were charged with selling securities to customers at unfair and fraudulent prices. The NASD has censured and imposed a \$10,000 fine on Mills, branch office manager, and suspended him for one year. Prisco, Munto and Lehl were each censured and fined \$5,000.

The Commission rejected applicants' claim that they should not be helliable for excessive prices because they had been told, and believed that the firm was a market maker in the security and thus entitled to "take the spread." The Commission concluded that applicants' gross commissions were such a high percentage of the customer's cost that the should have known that the prices were excessive.

The Commission also sustained the finding that Mills and Prisco acter fraudulently, finding that they were reckless. Lehl and Munton however, were inexperienced, effected relatively few transactions and appear to have reasonably believed the firm's assurances. Accordingly, the Commission set aside the NASD finding that Lehl and Munton acter fraudulently. (Rel. 34-34196)

NASD DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDING AGAINST JAMES MORRILL SET ASIDE

The Commission has set aside NASD disciplinary action against Jame Anthony Morrill of Saratoga Springs, New York. The NASD had found the Morrill failed to honor an arbitration award made against him, is violation of Article III, Section 1 of the NASD's Rules of Fair Practice. The NASD has censured Morrill, fined him \$10,000, and barred him from association with any NASD member in any capacity, but would have reduced the bar to a three-day suspension if, within thirty day of the NASD's decision, Morrill had paid the underlying arbitration award.

Morrill claimed that he had never received notice of the arbitration hearing. Based on the record before it, the Commission found that, when the NASD requested that Morrill pay the arbitration award, he twick wrote upon the NASD's suggestion, to the NASD about the lack of notice of the hearing. The Commission noted that Morrill should have moved to vacate the award. Here, however, the NASD did not respond to the letters nor inform Morrill that it was not the proper forum for the objection. Finding that Morrill relied on the NASD's suggestion, the Commission set aside the NASD's disciplinary action. (Rel. 34-34197)

MOTION FOR CIVIL CONTEMPT FILED AGAINST WILLIAM COOPER, ROBERT LINDLEY AND VALERIE JENSEN

On June 10, 1994, the Commission filed a Motion for Civil Contempt Against Defendants William E. Cooper ("Cooper"), Robert E. Lindley ("Lindley") and Valerie Jensen ("Jensen") based on their failure to provide accountings as required by the Order of Preliminary Injunction issued by the Court on May 23, 1994.

The Commission's Motion requests that the Court find Cooper, Lindley and Jensen in contempt of the Order and order them to provide accountings of their assets to the Commission. The Motion further requests that they be incarcerated if they do not comply with the Order.

The Commission's complaint alleges that Cooper, VestCorp Securities, Inc. ("VestCorp"), First Pension Corporation ("First Pension"), Lindley and Jensen violated the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The complaint alleges that up to \$124 million in investor funds are at risk, including \$25 million misappropriated from First Pension and \$99 million raised through the sale of real estate limited partnerships through VestCorp. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SECURITY EQUITY FUND, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by Security Equity Fund, Inc. under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act amending a previous order (Prior Order) that granted applicants relief from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder. The Prior Order lets applicants offer multiple classes of shares, assess a contingent deferred sales charge (CDSC) on certain redemptions of shares, and waive the CDSC in certain cases. The requested order replaces two of the waiver categories described in the Prior Order with more inclusive categories, and permits applicants to waive the CDSC in three additional cases. (Rel. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Central and South West Corporation (CSW), a registered holding company, and its subsidiary

companies, Central and South West Services, Inc. (CSWS), Central Power and Light Company, Public Service Company of Oklahoma, Southwestern Electric Power Company, West Texas Utilities Company and Transok, Inc., to increase CSWS' individual authority from \$90 million to \$110 million, to issue, sell and acquire short-term notes under short-term borrowing programs and the CSW System Money Pool through March 31, 1995. The Commission has reserved jurisdiction over \$20 million of CSW's proposed borrowing authority and \$40 million of CSWS' proposed authority. (Rel. 35-26066)

ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), an electric utility subsidiary company of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company. AP&L proposes to enter into arrangements for the issuance and sale, through December 31, 1996, by one or more governmental authorities, of tax-exempt bonds (Tax-Exempt Bonds) in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$200 million. In order to obtain a more favorable rating on the Tax-Exempt Bonds, AP&L may arrange for one or more irrevocable letter(s) of credit for an aggregate amount up to \$226 million from a bank (Bank). In order to induce the Bank to issue such letter of credit, AP&L would enter into a Letter of Credit and Reimbursement Agreement with the Bank pursuant to which AP&L would agree to reimburse the Bank for all amounts drawn, under such letter of credit within a specified period after the date of the draw and with interest thereon. AP&L may also (a) provide an insurance policy for the payment of the principal of and/or interest, and/or premium on the Tax-Exempt Bonds, and/or (b) pledge first mortgage bonds as security for holders of Tax-Exempt Bonds and/or the Bank. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (NASD) filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-93-31) that would eliminate access market maker procedures, as set forth in Part IX of Schedule D to the By-Laws, whereby a registered Nasdaq market maker can enter quotations into the Nasdaq System on behalf of another market maker who does not subscribe to Level 3 service. (Rel. 34-34217)

The Depository Trust Company (DTC) has filed a proposed rule change (SR-DTC-94-07) to establish the stock loan income-tracking system. Publication of the notice is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 20. (Rel. 34-34218)

The Options Clearing Corporation has filed a proposed rule change (SR- 0CC-93-06) relating to conversion of the delivery versus payment

authorization processs to an on-line system. The rule change was effective upon filing. (Rel. 34-34219)

The International Securities Clearing Corporation has filed a proposed rule change (SR-ISCC-94-1) that amends it clearing fund formula. (Rel. 34-34222; International Series Release No. 674)
