The subject matter of the open meeting scheduled for Tuesday, November 1, 1994, at 10:00 a.m., will be:

1. Consideration of whether to adopt Rule 3a12-11 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) exempting debt securities listed on a national securities exchange from the restrictions on borrowing of Section 8(a) and most of the proxy, shareholder communications, and information statement rules of Sections 14(a), 14(b), and 14(c) of the Exchange Act. In addition, consideration of whether to adopt amendments providing for the automatic effectiveness of Form 8-A registration statements for listed debt securities and the elimination of the filing fee associated with Form 8-A registration statements for listed debt. Applicants propose to make short-term borrowings through December 31, 1996, evidenced in the case of Northeast, CL&P, WMECO, PSNH, Holyoke, Nuclear, and Rocky River, by notes and in the case of CL&P, WMECO and Northeast, by commercial paper;

continue to use, through December 31, 1996, the Northeast Utilities System Money Pool (Money Pool); and allow Northeast, under the terms of the Money Pool, to borrow funds to, in turn, lend those funds through the Money Pool to PSNH, Nuclear, North Atlantic, Rocky River, Quinnehtuk and HEC. Borrowings shall not exceed the following amounts: Northeast-\$150 million, CL&P--\$325 million; WMECO--\$60 million; PSNH--\$175 million; Holyoke--\$5 million; Nuclear--\$50 million; North Atlantic-\$50 million; Rocky River--\$22 million; Quinnehtuk--\$8 million; and HEC-\$11 million. # CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Consolidated Natural Gas Company (CNG), a registered holding company, and its wholly owned, nonutility subsidiary companies, Consolidated System LNG Company, CNG Research Company, CNG Energy Company (CNG Energy), Consolidated Natural Gas Service Company, Inc., CNG Coal Company, CNG Producing Company and its subsidiary CNG Pipeline Company, CNG Transmission Corporation (CNGT), CNG Storage Service Company, CNG Gas Services Corporation, and CNG's wholly owned public-utility subsidiary companies, The Peoples Natural Gas Company, The East Ohio Gas Company, Virginia Natural Gas, Inc., Hope Gas, Inc., and West Ohio Gas Company (collectively, Applicants). Applicants propose that CNG Energy invest up to \$2 million in CNG Market Center Services, Inc. (CNGMC), a newly-formed corporation, with funds from the sale of shares of CNG Energy common stock to CNG, and open accounts advances and/or long-term loans; that CNGMC invest up to \$2 million in a partnership (Partnership) with Sabine Hub Services Company with funds from the sale of common stock to CNG Energy, open account advances and/or long-term loans; for CNGMC to make up to \$2 million in capital contributions to the Partnership; and for CNGMC to participate in the Money Pool. Applicants propose that the investment in the Partnership will not exceed \$2 million. (Rel. 35-26148)
