
CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

**FINAL JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION
AND OTHER RELIEF ENTERED AGAINST MORGAN F. MOORE**

The Commission filed a complaint for a permanent injunction and other relief on March 3 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut against Morgan F. Moore of New Canaan, Connecticut. The complaint alleges violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in connection with trading in the securities of Posi-Seal International, Inc. Without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, Moore consented to a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief, requiring, among other things, disgorgement of profits realized from the alleged trading violations and a civil penalty equal to such profits under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984.

The complaint alleges, among other things, that: Moore was a psychiatrist for the spouse of a Posi-Seal official; in a session with the official relating to Moore's treatment of the spouse, Moore learned material non-public information concerning the acquisition of Posi-Seal by Fisher Controls International, Inc.; and Moore, in breach of a duty arising from a relationship of trust and confidence, knowing such information to be material and non-public, then purchased Posi-Seal common stock. (SEC v. Morgan F. Moore, D. CT, Civil Action No. N-86-88-PCD). (LR-11013)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLIED CAPITAL CORPORATION

An order has been issued exempting the proposed transaction by Allied Capital Corporation, Allied Investment Corporation (Investment), Allied Advisory, Inc., Allied Venture Partnership (Venture) and Allied Management Partners from the provisions of Section 17(a) of the Investment Company Act, and permitting Investment and Venture to participate to the extent of \$500,000 each in a \$10,000,000 senior subordinated debt financing. (Rel. IC-14961 - Feb. 27)

PACTEL CAPITAL RESOURCES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Pactel Capital Resources, subsidiary of Pacific Telesis Group, requesting an order exempting Pactel from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14964 - Feb. 28)

BANCO CENTRAL, S.A.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Banco Central, S.A., for an order exempting it and certain of its United States subsidiaries from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with their proposed issuance of debt securities in the United States. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 24 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Southern Company, a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries to issue and sell short-term notes, term-loan notes and commercial paper. (Rel. 35-24034 - Feb. 28)

An order has been issued authorizing Southern to issue and sell at competitive bidding up to 2,500,000 shares of common stock from time to time and in varying amounts through March 31, 1987. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the issuance and sale of 7,500,000 additional shares as to which the record is not yet complete. (Rel. 35-24038 - March 3)

CEDAR COAL COMPANY

A supplemental order has been authorizing certain subsidiaries of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to lease additional mining equipment with an aggregate acquisition cost estimated at approximately \$23 million from a nonassociate company. (Rel. 35-24035 - Feb. 28)

ALLEGHENY GENERATING COMPANY

A supplemental order has been authorizing the fees and expenses incurred in connection with a revolving credit agreement entered into by Allegheny Generating Company with a group of 11 banks of up to \$400 million with a maturity of December 31, 1990. Applicants incurred fees and expenses in the amount of \$62,910. (Rel. 35-24036 - March 3)

COLUMBUS AND SOUTHERN OHIO ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been authorizing Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to sell its existing Broadway Substation #168 to the city of Jackson, Ohio, for a total price of \$117,714.00. (Rel. 35-24037 - March 3)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-85-49) and granted accelerated approval to proposed rule changes submitted by the American and New York Stock Exchanges (SR-Amex-86-2, SR-NYSE-86-6) to extend the close of trading and exercise cut-off times for index options traded on the above-named exchanges from 3:10 p.m. to 3:15 p.m. (Chicago time) and 4:10 p.m. to 4:15 p.m. (New York Time), respectively.
