ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

TWO BROKERAGE FIRMS AND THEIR PRESIDENTS SANCTIONED

The Commission has imposed sanctions on two brokerage firms, G.C. George Securities, Inc. (George, Inc.), of Spokane, Washington, and Jerry T. O'Brien, Inc., doing business as Pennaluna & Company (Pennaluna), of Wallace, Idaho, and their respective presidents, Grover Cleveland George and Jerry T. O'Brien. Effective February 27, the securities activities of George Inc. will be restricted for three months, and those of Pennaluna for two months. During those periods, the firms (1) may only accept unsolicited orders for securities, but may execute any orders they have on hand as of February 27; (2) may not make a market in any security, except for those securities in which they are already making a market as of that date; and (3) may not make any new underwriting commitment, but may honor any such commitment they have already made as of such date. In addition, the Commission suspended George from association with any broker or dealer for a period of six months, and O'Brien from any such association for a period of four months. The suspensions are also effective February 27.

The Commission found that, from 1972 to 1974, respondents unlawfully sold unregistered securities of nine mining companies, engaging in "massive distributions of unregistered securities over an extended period of time." It also found that in 1974, George Inc. and George failed to comply with customer protection requirements. The Commission agreed with the assessment of an administrative law judge that "[t]he registration violations occurred under such suspicious circumstances that it can only be concluded that respondents acted intentionally or with extreme recklessness." CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ISSUED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on February 8 Judge James O. Ellison, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Oklahoma, issued an order temporarily restraining Donald E. Smolen of Tulsa, Oklahoma. The order, which expired February 20, 1984, restrains Smolen from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Smolen consented to the entry of the order without admitting or denying the allegations set forth in the Commission's complaint.

The complaint, which was filed on February 7, alleges, among other things, that Smolen purchased options contracts through various broker-dealers and issued checks to pay for the securities. He then stopped payment on certain of these checks and knew that certain others would not be honored when presented for payment. The complaint further alleged that, as a result of the foregoing, Smolen's options positions were liquidated and the broker-dealers lost a combined total of approximately \$750,000. (SEC v. Donald E. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing American Electric Power Company, Inc. and its subsidiary electric utility company, Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, to amend nuclear fuel leases for the acquisition of nuclear material for use at Units No. 1 and 2 of the Donald C. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

EXXON CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on application of Exxon Corporation and Exxon Pipeline Company that the trusteeship of Citibank, N.A., under four indentures would not, despite a guarantee by Exxon of obligations of Pipeline, be so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Citibank from acting as trustee under the indentures after such guarantee. (NYSE) to amend NYSE's rules to accommodate the listing and trading of industry index options. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of Feb. 20. The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-83-30) filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. (CBOE) to codify existing trade matching procedures for index options and options on stocks trading exdividend or ex-distribution on the day following the option trade date.
