## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

EXCHANCE COMMISSION

PROPOSED TO ADOPT RULE 3a4-1

The Commission is reproposing for public comment Securities Exchange Act Rule 3a4-1 to provide that, under certain circumstances, persons associated with an issuer of securities who participate in a sale of those securities shall not be deemed "brokers", as defined in Section 3(a)(4) of the Exchange Act. The reproposed rule sets forth those circumstances under which issuer's employees could participate in the sale of the issuer's securities without being required to register as broker-dealers. The rule, the so-called "issuer's exemption" rule, was originally proposed in 1977.

PROPOSED NEW REGISTRATION FORMS S-4 AND F-4 --BUSINESS COMBINATION TRANSACTIONS

The Commission is proposing for public comment new registration forms, Forms S-4 (for all registrants) and F-4 (for certain foreign private issuers), which would be available for registration of securities in business combination transactions, including exchange offers. The proposed Forms would replace current Forms S-14 and S-15 and would extend the principles underlying the integrated disclosure system (particularly the concept of incorporation by reference) to the business combinations context. The availability of proposed Forms S-4 and F-4 for exchange offers would implement one of the two recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Tender Offers intended to place exchange offers on the same expedited timetable as cash tender offers.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

HERMAN FRIEDMAN SANCTIONED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Herman Friedman. Simultaneously, the Commission accepted Friedman's Offer of Settlement. The Commission found that in 1984, Friedman was convicted by a New York County jury on 15 separate securities-related criminal counts. The Commission's Order bars Friedman from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer but provides that after two years he may apply to become so associated.

In his Offer of Settlement, Friedman consented to the Commission's Order without admitting or denying the allegations, except that he admitted his convictions. (Rel. 34-20899)

#### HARLAN, ROBERTS, INC. AND LANE HARLAN JACOBS CITED

The Commission announced that in public administrative proceedings ordered under Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, Harlan, Roberts, Inc. (Registrant), a registered broker-dealer located in New York City, and Lane Harlan Jacobs, Registrant's president, director, and chief financial officer, submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission accepted. Registrant and Jacobs consented to the Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein.

The Commission's Order finds that Registrant, aided and abetted by Jacobs, wilfully violated the registration provisions, net capital rule, bookkeeping rules, financial reporting requirements, and supplemental reporting requirements of the Exchange Act.

The Commission censured Registrant and ordered it to comply with an undertaking requiring that it file, for one year, quarterly financial reports with the Commission's New York Regional Office after their review by an independent public accountant. The Commission barred Jacobs from association with any broker or dealer in a supervisory capacity in financial, bookkeeping and back office functions, provided that after three years, he can apply for association in any capacity and include with any such application an affidavit stating that he has taken and passed the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc.'s Financial and Operations Principals Examination (Series 27). ## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

ASSOCIATED MEDICAL DEVICES CORPORATION ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on May 7 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Associated Medical Devices Corporation (AMD) of Carlsbad, California restraining and enjoining it from failing to file and filing late periodic reports with the Commission. AMD, consenting to the Court's Judgment, admitted that it failed to file or filed late reports on 13 separate occasions and failed to file required Notifications of Late Filing on 12 separate occasions. The complaint was filed on February 14.

The Court ordered AMD to file its delinquent annual and quarterly reports and enjoined it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Associated Medical Devices, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 84-0465). (LR-10370)

COMPLAINT NAMES TVC IMAGE TECHNOLOGY, INC.

The Commission filed a civil injunctive action on May 8 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against TVC Image Technology, Inc. of New York, New York. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a judgment of permanent injunction and other equitable relief.

The Commission alleges that TVC, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file: its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended December 31, 1983; various periodic reports on time; and Notifications of Late Filing on Form 12b-25. The Commission requests that the Court order TVC to file its delinquent Annual Report and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. TVC Image Technology, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 84-1426). (LR-10371)

# **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

EQUITABLE VARIABLE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued on an application filed by Equitable Variable Life Insurance Company (EVLICO), Separate Accounts I and II of EVLICO, and The Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States granting exemptions from the provisions of Sections 2(a) (32), 2(a) (35), 18(i), 22(c), 22(d), 27(a) (1), 27(a) (2), 27(a) (3), 27(c) (1), 27(d), and 27(f) of the Investment Company Act and Rules 6e-2(b) (1), 6e-2(b) (10), 6e-2(b) (12), 6e-2(b) (13), 6e-2(c), 22c-1, and 27f-1 to permit the transactions described in the application. #### THE CHASE MANHATTAN BANK OF CANADA

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 1 to request a hearing on an application of The Chase Manhattan Bank of Canada for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-13932 - May 8)

T. ROWE PRICE NEW INCOME FUND, INC.

An order has been issued declaring that Anthony W. Deering shall not be deemed an interested person of T. Rowe Price New Income Fund, Inc., and other T. Rowe Price mutual funds, and any other mutual funds to be formed in the future by T. Rowe Price Associates, Inc., within the meaning of Section 2(a)(19) of the Investment Company Act solely by reason of his being a director of a registered broker-dealer. (Rel. IC-13933 - May 8)

## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 1 to request a hearing on a proposal by Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, to make equity investments of up to \$10 million prior to December 31, 1984 in Monongahela Power Company, a wholly-owned subsidiary. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
