COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC TO CELEBRATE 50th ANNIVERSARY, HOLD THIRD ANNUAL MAJOR ISSUES CONFERENCE

The Commission will celebrate its 50th anniversary with a run, the third annual Major Issues Conference and a celebration for all "alumni". Celebrations will begin on June 27th, at 7:00 p.m. with the "SEC 10-K", a 10 Kilometer race on the Lincoln Memorial and Reflecting Pool Grounds. All SEC staff, alumni and families as well as participants in the SEC's bi-annual Major Issues Conference can sign up.

The Major Issues Conference will begin on June 28th. The two-day conference will feature panels on the convergence of the financial service industries, on merger and acquisition issues, enforcement, collective investment vehicle regulation, and technology in the securities industry. Donald Regan, Secretary of the Treasury, will be the keynote speaker for luncheon on the 28th. George Bush, Vice President of the United States, will be the dinner speaker.

On June 29th, a reception and dinner will be held for all SEC alumni. It will be attended by all former SEC Chairmen, and at least 15 ex-Commissioners. Alumni who wish to attend the anniversary celebration should contact Betty Lear of the Executive Director's Office.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

CATHERINE M. SCOTT SANCTIONED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Catherine M. Scott of Houston, Texas, a person associated with a registered broker-dealer. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted Scott's Offer of Settlement in which she consented to an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions, without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein. The Order finds that: Scott violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the purchase and sale of listed call options for the accounts of her customers from January 1981 through October 1981; and an Order of Permanent Injunction was entered in the District for the Southern District of Texas permanently enjoining Scott from further violating the antifraud provisions.

The Commission's Order imposes sanctions which suspend Scott from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company for 90 days, and bars her from serving in a supervisory capacity with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company. (Rel. 34-20934)

GEORGE F. SPEICHER, III SANCTIONED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against George F. Speicher, III of Houston, Texas, a person associated with a registered broker-dealer. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted Speicher's Offer of Settlement in which he consented to an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions, without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein. The Order finds that Speicher violated the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act in the purchase and sale of equity securities and listed call options by Speicher for his own benefit in an account which he caused to be opened in the name of a friend in July 1983.

The Commission's Orders imposes sanctions which suspend Speicher from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company for 45 calendar days. (Rel. 34-20935)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL INJUNCTIVE CASE FILED AGAINST WASHINGTON CORPORATION

The Seattle Regional Office filed a complaint on May 3 in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Washington against Ability Information Systems, Inc., a Washington corporation. The complaint alleges that Ability violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 in sales of its securities to the public raising more than \$600,000. No date has yet been set for trial. (SEC v. Ability Information Systems, Inc., No. 84-325-JLQ, ED WA). (LR-10378)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

DAVID G. ANDREAE INDICTED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on May 7 a 20-count indictment was returned against David G. Andreae. The indictment, which was brought in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan, Southern Division, at Detroit, alleges mail fraud, interstate transportation of property obtained by fraud, and the offer for sale of unregistered securities.

The indictment alleges that Andreae: collected, between 1973 and 1981, more than two million dollars from various investors who had been solicited to invest in numerous gas well drilling, rework, and pipeline projects in West Virginia; did not undertake the projects as he had represented; grossly exaggerated project costs; converted large sums of money to his own use; and, in order to lull investors into a false sense of security, mailed them false progress reports and small amounts of money as a purported return on their investment. (U.S. v. David G. Andreae, Cr. 84-20281, USDC, ED MI, S. Div.). (LR-10379)

THE PRUDENTIAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA

NEW ENGLAND ENERGY INCORPORATED

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-84-6) amending MSRB Rules G-12(f) and G-15(d) to clarify the definition of an "indirect participant" of a clearing agency. (Rel. 34-20952)

TEMPORARY APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the Options Clearing Corporation (SR+OCC-84-8) has been temporarily approved, on an accelerated basis, under Section 19(b)(2) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change amends OCC's By-laws to allow OCC to reimburse itself from its Stock Clearing Fund and Non-Equity Securities Clearing Fund in the event OCC sustains losses from the failure of banks used by OCC for clearance and settlement operations. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

CRITERION ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act on an application of Criterion Acceptance Corporation that the trusteeship of First National Bank of Minneapolis under two indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify First Minneapolis from acting as trustee.
