Units of each trust series, a new type of securities trading and investment product, will be issued in exchange for shares of a single industrial issuer, and may be divided by a unitholder into two separately tradeable component parts: (a) carrying the dividend and voting rights in the underlying common stock; and (b) the right to its capital appreciation over a specified price as of a specified future date.

The Commission has received letters from several corporations and individuals raising concerns about the Americus Trust concept relating to the trading markets, shareholder communications, the Williams Act, and corporate governance. The Commission may solicit public comment to assist it in determining whether there are any legal, regulatory, or public policy concerns that warrant special consideration or action by the Commission regarding this new security product. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NASD ACTION AGAINST JOSEPH J. BALINT AFFIRMED

The Commission affirmed sanctions imposed on Joseph J. Balint of Elmhurst, Illinois. Balint was formerly the financial and operations principal of an NASD member firm. The NASD censured him and fined him \$250.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that Balint, who was responsible for his firm's compliance with customer protection requirements, failed to send the necessary telegraphic notice to the Commission and the NASD in December 1981 when his firm made an inadequate deposit in its Special Reserve Bank Account for the Exclusive Benefit of Customers. The Commission also found that Balint persisted in that failure despite the NASD's subsequent advice to send the required notice. The Commission pointed out that its customer protection rule requires that telegraphic notice be sent whenever a deposit is not made in accordance with a firm's contemporaneous reserve computation, and that the obligation to send notice continues until proper notification is given.

In affirming the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission emphasized that the customer protection rule "is fundamental to the safeguarding of customers' funds" and that "it is essential that regulatory authorities be notified quickly of any potential problem in meeting deposit requirements". ALAN D. PLATT BARRED

The Commission entered Findings and Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Alan D. Platt, a former registered representative with a Denver broker-dealer and former president of American Petroleum, Inc. (API). The Commission's Order was entered under Platt's Offer of Settlement, in which he admitted a 1983 criminal conviction but otherwise neither admitted nor denied the allegations contained in the Commission's September 20, 1983 Order for Proceedings [Rel. 34-20210].

Platt consented to findings that he: violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws; and was convicted, in August 1983, of theft and fraud in the sale of securities issued by API [State of Colorado v. Alan Dale Platt, Criminal Action No. 82-CR-228, County of Arapahoe 1982].

The Order bars Platt from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer provided that after five years he may reapply to become so associated in a supervised, non-supervisory, non-proprietary capacity. He may reapply only if he has complied with the requirements in his criminal judgment to make restitution to investors. (Rel. 34-20951)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

MARC G. ZILBERT CONSENTS TO PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND OTHER RELIEF

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on May 10 Alcee L. Hastings, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief against Marc G. Zilbert, also known as Jim Collins, of Hollywood, Florida, enjoining him from further violations

of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Zilbert consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

Zilbert was enjoined from making misrepresentations of material facts and omissions of material fact in the offer, purchase and sale of Sunco Resource & Energy Ltd., Inc's fractional, undivided interests in oil and gas rights. Zilbert consented to an order requiring him to disgorge \$21,000 to Robert W. Pearce, the Sunco Receiver, payable \$7,500 within 10 days from entry of the Final Judgment, another \$7,500 within 60 days from entry of the Final Judgment, and \$250 a month for 24 months beginning 90 days from entry of the Final Judgment.

The March 9 complaint alleged that Zilbert and others raised approximately \$2.5 million from approximately 125 investors residing throughout the United States. (SEC v. Sunco Resource & Energy Ltd., Inc., et al., USDC SDFL, Civil Action No. 84-0618-CIV-ALH). (LR-10382)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MUTUAL BENEFIT LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 11 to request a hearing on an application filed by Mutual Benefit Life Insurance Company and Mutual Benefit Variable Contract Account - 7 for an order exempting them from provisions of Sections 12(b), 17(f), and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act and Rules 12b-1 and 17f-2 to permit the transaction described in the application. MERRILL LYNCH KECALP GROWTH INVESTMENTS LIMITED PARTNERSHIP 1982

ORDER APPROVING PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on a final basis, a proposed rule change of the National Securities Clearing Corporation. The proposal (SR-NSCC-84-5) enables NSCC to implement its Municipal Comparison Only System. The Commission, in Release 34-20795 (March 28, 1984), previously approved the proposal for a 45-day period. IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES
