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## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

HALPERT, OBERST AND COMPANY AND ALAN P. HALPERT CITED

> The Commission ordered public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Halpert, Oberst and Company (Registrant), a registered brokerdealer located in Millburn, New Jersey, and one of its principals, Alan P. Halpert. The Order for Public Proceedings alleges that Registrant wilfully violated, and Halpert wilfully aided and abetted violations of, the customer protection, bookkeeping, financial reporting, quarterly security count and fingerprint provisions of the Exchange Act and the books and records provisions of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board. A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Registrant and Halpert are true, and if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action under the Exchange Act is appropriate. ### **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

#### CHADRON ENERGY CORPORATION ENJOINED

The Commission announced the filing of a complaint for permanent injunction and other equitable relief on June 19 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Chadron Energy Corporation, formerly a bank holding company, Dennis R. Staal, Thomas R. Landers, William G. Scheopner, Gordon L. Larson, George R. Wulf, William J. Blough, Craig K. Madson, Loy C. Banks, Joe D. Banks and Leslie W. Hawkey, Jr. The complaint alleges, among other things, that Chadron failed to comply with the terms of a public offering of securities.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint and without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, the defendants, except Staal and Landers, consented to Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief. The Final Judgments enjoin the defendants variously from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud, periodic reporting, beneficial ownership and ownership reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The court also ordered Chadron to comply with certain undertakings. Among other things, the undertakings provide for the disgorgement to shareholders other than defendants in the Commission's civil injunctive action certain funds or damages awarded to or recovered by Chadron. # **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

#### THE BOSTON COMPANY FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 31 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Boston Company Fund, The American Express Funds, The Boston Company Advisors, Inc., American Express Company, and American Express Service Corp. for an order exempting them from Section 17(a) of the Investment Company Act, and implementing the proposed reorganization. ## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 30 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Southern Company, a registered holding company, to create a subsidiary. The initial operations of the subsidiary will be confined to the preliminary study, investigation, research and development of new business or investment opportunities and the direction, coordination and conduct of such activities. Southern also proposes to acquire common stock in Integrated Communication System, Inc. (Rel. 35-23361 - July 6)

## **SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS**

#### AMENDED FILING

The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. submitted copies of Amendment No. 3 to an NYSE proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-84-3). Amendment No. 3 would modify the proposed rule change - which authorizes the NYSE to trade certain individual listed stock options - by adding to NYSE Rule 758 a subparagraph prohibiting an NYSE member registered as both a Competitive Options Trader and an equity Registered Competitive Market-Maker or equity Competitive Trader from personally effecting a proprietary transaction in an individual option on an NYSE listed stock if the number was present on the NYSE equity floor during the preceding hour. #### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes filed by Midwest Clearing Corporation (SR-MCC-84-4) and Pacific Clearing Corporation (SR-PCC-84-9). The proposals would authorize MCC and PCC to link their automated comparison systems to National Securities Clearing Corporation's Municipal Bond Processing System to compare municipal securities transactions of their participants. The proposals also create Municipal Comparison Only membership categories to enable municipal securities brokers and dealers to receive automated comparison of their municipal securities transactions without becoming full settling participants of MCC or PCC. The proposals allow MCC and PCC to develop operational experience prior to August 1, 1984, when use of automated comparison systems for certain inter-dealer municipal securities transactions becomes mandatory under Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board rules.
