ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

VICE PRESIDENT OF NEW JERSEY BOND DEALER SUSPENDED

The Commission announced that Robert J. O'Brien, vice president of First Inter-regional Equity Corp., a northern New Jersey municipal securities dealer, has been suspended effective June 20, 1983 from acting in a supervisory capacity for 120 days. O'Brien consented, without admitting or denying the charges, to the suspension and to the entry of findings that in his supervisory capacity he wilfully aided and abetted violations of the securities laws, including the antifraud and recordkeeping provisions, and that he failed reasonably to supervise persons. The Commission's action concludes the administrative proceedings in this matter. (Rel. 34-19784)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM L. EDDLEMAN PRELIMINARILY ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on May 13 the Honorable Norman Black, Judge for the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas, Houston Division, issued an order of preliminary injunction against William L. Eddleman, Jr. enjoining him from further violations of and/or aiding and abetting violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the antifraud and recordkeeping provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and the affiliated transaction, recordkeeping and pricing provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940. The order, which will be in effect until August 15, 1983 unless extended by the Court, was entered pursuant to Eddleman's consent and without his admitting or denying the allegations set forth in the Commission's complaint. (SEC v. Archer U.S. Government Guaranteed Securities Fund, Inc., et al., S.D. Tex., Houston Division, Civil Action No. H-83-2608). (LR-10005)

APPLIED DEVICES CORPORATION ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on May 17 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Applied Devices Corporation of Palm Beach, Florida restraining and enjoining Applied from failing to file timely periodic reports and ordering it to comply with certain undertakings. The Commission, in its complaint which was filed on March 24, alleged that Applied, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file and file timely with the Commission certain annual and quarterly reports required to have been filed. Applied, consenting to the entry of the Court's judgment, admitted that it had filed reports in an untimely manner on six separate occasions. (SEC v. Applied Devices Corporation, U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 83-0839). (LR-10008)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

RHODE ISLAND BROKER PLEADS GUILTY; SON ACQUITTED

The Boston Regional Office and the United States Attorney in Rhode Island announced that: on May 6 Bernard Cohen of Cranston, Rhode Island, pleaded guilty to two counts of an indictment, returned on January 27, charging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws and the Mail Fraud Statute. The counts to which B. Cohen pleaded alleged antifraud violations of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Mail Fraud Statute in the public offer and sale of certificates of participation in bank certificates of deposit. It was charged that the securities in question were fictitious and that the certificates of deposit never existed.

On May 12 Neil L. Cohen, of West Warwick, Rhode Island, son of B. Cohen, was acquitted by a jury in Providence, RI, of three charges alleging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws and the Mail Fraud Statute. The acquittal came after two and one-half days of trial. N. Cohen had been charged in the same indictment returned against his father.

At the trial, the elder Cohen testified that he had offered and sold fictitious certificates of participation, but that his son Neil knew nothing of the activities.

Both Cohens were principals in Rhode Island securities firms, Neil Stephens Associates, Inc. and Neil Stephens Investments Corp.

Sentencing for B. Cohen was set for June 25 before Chief Judge Boyle of the Rhode Island Federal District Court. (U.S. v. Bernard Cohen and Neil L. Cohen, D.C. RI, CR-83-006-02). (LR-10002)
