ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

JOSEPH LUGO SANCTIONED

The Commission accepted an offer of settlement from Joseph Lugo of North Miami, Florida and issued an order making findings and imposing remedial sanctions under Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Lugo. Lugo, in his offer of settlement, consented to the entry of the Commission's findings and order without admitting or denying any of the matters therein.

The Commission had found that Lugo violated Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-6 thereunder in connection with trading in the common stock and warrants of Intercontinental Diamond Corporation in 1980.

Lugo has been suspended from association with any broker-dealer for ten days beginning September 19, 1983. (Rel. 34-20179 - Sept. 14)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES JOHN P. MCGOFF AND GLOBAL COMMUNICATIONS

On September 14, the Commission filed a complain for permanent injunction in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia seeking injunctive relief against John P. McGoff and Global Communications Corporation. The complaint alleges that McGoff and Global violated the beneficial ownership and proxy reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

Concurrently with the filing of the complaint, the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered final judgments of permanent injunction against McGoff and Global enjoining them from violations of Sections 13(d) and 14(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 13d-1, 12b-20, 14a-3 and 14a-9 thereunder. McGoff and Global consented to the entry of the final judgments without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint.

The complaint alleged that McGoff and Global: (1) acquired the beneficial ownership of more than 5% of the common stock of Panax Corporation and filed with the Commission and sent to Panax a Schedule 13D and amendments which did not completely and accurately

set forth the information required and which failed to contain material information necessary to make the filing not misleading;

(2) failed to disclose in their Schedule 13D or in later amendments Global's and McGoff's relationship with the Government of the Republic of South Africa (RSA), including the fact that the RSA was an affiliate of Global and McGoff, by virtue of funding through a Swiss corporation of Global's operations, the aforesaid loan arrangements and the pledging of Global's stock to the Swiss corporation;

(3) solicited proxies and permitted their names to be used to solicit proxies in respect of the common stock of Panax by means of proxy statements that failed to contain the information required by the Exchange Act, and that contained false and misleading statements and omitted material facts. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

LANDESBANK SCHLESWIG-HOLSTEIN GIROZENTRALE

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 7 to request a hearing on an application filed by Landesbank Schleswig-Holstein Girozentrale, a West German commercial bank, for an order (under Section 6(c) of the Act) exempting it from all provisions of the Act so that it may publicly offer and sell commercial paper notes in the United States. HOSPITAL CORPORATION OF AMERICA
