## NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

---

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted pursuant to provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration. The Commission will not normally meet on Mondays or Fridays.

The subject matter of the November 22 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to rescind or amend certain rules under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 to conform those rules with the elimination of the Commission's SECO program (i.e., direct regulation of broker-dealers who are not members of a SRO) effective December 6, 1983. ## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

---

### PRUDENTIAL-BACHE SECURITIES, INC., OTHERS CITED

The Commission instituted administrative proceedings, under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against Prudential-Bache Securities, Inc., Richard Saccullo and William Bruce Schaefer. The proceedings concern a free-riding scheme involving the common stock of various issuers and the manipulation of the common stock of Conner Homes Corporation. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the respondents submitted Offers of Settlement consenting, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to the Order which makes certain findings and orders various sanctions.

Under their Offers of Settlement: Bache was censured and agreed to review its credit procedure and adopt and maintain any further policies and procedures deemed appropriate to prevent unlawful extensions of credit; Saccullo was suspended from acting in a supervisory or managerial capacity with any regulated entity for 30 days; Schaefer was barred from serving as a supervisor, manager, officer, director or principal with any regulated entity, suspended from association with any regulated entity for 60 days, and prohibited for 12 months from acting as a registered representative for any account beneficially owned or controlled by Sidney Popkin. ## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

---

### SIDNEY POPKIN ENJOINED

The Commission filed a complaint for injunctive and other equitable relief in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Sidney Popkin, of Jacksonville, North Carolina. The complaint alleges violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud, manipulation, credit and beneficial ownership reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, Popkin consented to the Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction restraining and enjoining him from further violations of the aforesaid provisions.

The complaint alleges that from about January 1981 through August 1981 Popkin executed a fraudulent scheme to: amass and maintain a large portfolio of securities without meeting his obligation to pay for such securities; and artificially inflate the price of Conner Homes Corporation common stock in order to profit from the resale of such stock and to increase buying power in margin securities accounts holding such stock. ## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

---

### CRESTLINE INVESTMENT COMPANY, INC.

An order has been issued declaring that Crestline Investment Company, Inc., registered under the Investment Company Act as a closed-end, diversified, management investment company, has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-13626 - Nov. 15)

### DEAN WITTER REYNOLDS INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 12 to request a hearing on an application of Dean Witter World Wide Investment Trust (World Wide), Dean Witter Developing Growth Securities Trust (together referred to as the Funds), and Dean Witter Reynolds, Inc. (DWR), the Funds' investment manager. The application requests an order: (1) exempting World Wide (and any other funds for which DWR may now or in the future serve as investment adviser or principal underwriter) from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), and 22(a) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22d-1 to permit them to assess a contingent deferred sales charge on certain redemptions of their shares, and to waive that charge for redemptions following the death or disability of a shareholder and redemptions for certain distributions from an Individual Retirement Account or other qualified retirement plan; and (2) permitting exchanges of shares between the Funds without imposition of the charge. ## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### EASTERN EDISON COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 12 to request a hearing on a proposal by Eastern Edison Company, Blackstone Valley Electric Company, and Montaup Electric Company, subsidiaries of Eastern Utilities Associates, to issue short-term notes to banks in a combined amount of \$45 million outstanding at any one time from December 30, 1983 to December 28, 1984. ### MIDDLE SOUTH ENERGY, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing Middle South Energy (MSE), subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, to enter into one or more agreements to make fixed interest rate payments on a certain amount of an outstanding loan agreement debt of \$378 million through December 31, 1984. ### GEORGIA POWER COMPANY

### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-83-29). The proposed rule change amends Article III, Section 5 of the Exchange Constitution to delete the requirement that one of the four securities industry representatives on the Exchange's Nominating Committee shall have been a former governor who retired from the Board between one and four years prior to the commencement of his term of service on the Nominating Committee. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
