U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

JOHN C. SPENCER AND WILLIAM J. HAMILTON INDICTED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on September 27 John C. Spencer and William J. Hamilton, both of Atlanta, were indicted by a grand jury in Fulton County, Georgia, on five counts of offering to sell and selling promissory notes of Roy D. Warren Realty (Warren), while not being registered as securities salesmen and on seven counts of offering for sale and selling promissory notes of Warren while failing to disclose material statements necessary to make the statements made not misleading concerning Warren's financial condition and the pledge of its assets. (State of Georgia v. John C. Spencer and William J. Hamilton, Fulton County Superior Court, Georgia, A-37183).

NEUWIRTH INCOME DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION
