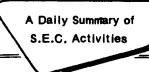


SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION DIGES NEWS

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

JANRU OPTIONS REVOKED, RUSH BARRED. The SEC has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Janru Options Corporation, New York City, and barred Donald G. Rush, its sole officer, from association with any broker or dealer. with the proviso that such action shall not limit or affect any trustee appointed to liquidate registrant's business in the performance of his functions pursuant to the Securities Investor Protection Act. The remedial action was based on findings that respondents were subject to a permanent injunction, and violated or aided and abetted violations of antifraud, net capital, customers free credit balances, recordkeeping and financial reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act.

According to the decision, from about October 1969 through July 1970, Rush executed orders for the purchase of stock of Perspective Systems, Inc. for an account which he opened with his then employer in his wife's maiden name without disclosing his relationship to the account and when neither he nor his wife was capable of paying for the stock, and typed up a confirmation indicating that his employer had purchased 800 shares of stock of Environmental Industries, Inc. at a price above the then prevailing market, when in fact no such purchase had been made. In addition, he and registrant were found to have effected transactions on behalf of others when registrant was incapable of promptly consummating such transactions, and converted to their own use monies paid y customers for the purchase of securities and refused, despite repeated customer demands, to complete the purchase and delivery of fully paid for securities.

Respondents did not file an answer to the order for proceedings and were in default, and the indicated findings were based upon the charges made against them. (Rel. 34-9491)

WANDERON & CO., INC. REVOKED, PRESIDENT BARRED. The SEC has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Wanderon & Co., Inc. of <u>Jersey City, New Jersey</u>, and barred its president, Thomas Wanderon, from association with a broker or dealer. The action was based on findings that the firm, aided and abetted by Wanderon, violated the net capital and recordkeeping provisions of the Securities Exchange Act, and that they had been enjoined by the United States District Court in New Jersey, on their consent, from violations of antifraud and net capital provisions. In the SEC proceedings, the firm and Wanderon failed to file answers to the allegations in the order for proceedings and were deemed to have defaulted. (Rel. 34-9497)

NEW RULES AND RULE PROPOSALS

ADOPTION OF AMENDED RULE 16a-6. The Commission has adopted amendments to Rule 16a-6 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The amended rule provides that the granting, acquisition, disposition, expiration or cancellation of presently exercisable puts, calls, options or other rights or obligations to buy or sell securities, whether or not they are transferable, shall be deemed a change in the beneficial ownership of the securities to which the right or obligation relates. The amended rule applies to initial statements filed on Form 3 on or after April 1, 1972 and to statements of changes in ownership filed on Form 4 for the month of April 1972 and or any period thereafter. ADOPTION OF REVISED FORMS 3 and 4. The Commission has adopted revisions of Forms 3 and 4 which are used for reporting security holdings and transactions pursuant to Section 16(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the corresponding provisions of the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935 and the Investment Company Act of 1940. The revised forms apply to all securities registered under Section 12 of the 1934 Act, whether listed on an exchange or traded in the over-the-counter market. Among other changes, the forms provide for the reporting of puts, calls, options and other rights and obligations to buy or sell securities. Initial statements of beneficial ownership of securities filed on or after April 1, 1972 are to be filed on the revised Form 3 and statements of changes in beneficial ownership of securities filed for the month of April 1972 and periods thereafter are to be filed on the revised Form 4. It is expected that printed copies of the revised forms for use in filing will be available about April 1. (Rel. 34-9500)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

JNT INVESTORS ENJOINED. The SEC New York Regional Office announced February 15 that the Federal court in New York had permanently enjoined JNT Investors, Inc., New York City broker-dealer, from violating the net capital requirements of the Federal securities laws and had appointed Jerry Klein as SIPC trustee. JNT consented to the court order and appointment of the trustee without admitting the allegations. (LR-5325)

FINANCIAL RELATIONS BOARD ENJOINED. The SEC Chicago Regional Office announced February 18 that the Federal court in Chicago had permanently enjoined Financial Relations Board, Inc. (FRB), Chicago financial public relations firm for Pig'N Whistle Corporation, from violating the antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with issuing news releases concerning Pig'N Whistle. FRB consented to the court order without admitting the allegations. (LR-5326)

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INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

<u>AETNA VARIABLE ACCOUNT</u>. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until March 9 to request a hearing upon an application of Aetna Life Variable Acct. A and Aetna Life Insurance Company, of Hartford, Conn., for an order declaring that Account A has ceased to be an investment company. According to the application, Aetna Life determined not to proceed with the proposed offering of variable annuity contracts through Account A, and in November 1971, the registration statement of Account A was withdrawn. INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP FUND. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until March 9 to request a hearing upon an application of Investment Partnership Fund, Inc., (Fund), San Francisco closed-end investment company, for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. According to the application, Fund has issued no securities, has no assets and has not engaged in any business transactions other than incorporating. Its registration statement has been withdrawn. (Rel. IC-7008)

ENVIRONMENT AND ECOLOGY FUND. The SEC has issued an order upon an application of Environment and Ecology Fund, Inc., of Boston, declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-7010)

SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

FIRST BANK SYSTEM, INC., 1400 First National Bank Bldg., <u>Minneapolis, Minn</u>. 55402, filed a registration statement on February 17 seeking registration of \$70 million of notes, due 1979, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by The First Boston Corp., 20 Exchange Fl., and Blyth & Co., Inc., 14 Wall Street, both of New York. First Bank is a bank holding company owning approximately 98% of the outstanding stock of 88 commercial banks and trust companies. Of the net proceeds of its financing, \$52,500,000 will be invested in subordinated debt of affiliated banks and the balance used for corporate purposes. (File 2-43104)

DUQUESNE LIGHT COMPANY, 435 Sixth Ave., Pittsburgh, Pa. 15219, filed a registration statement on February 17 seeking registration of 350,000 shares of cumulative preferred stock (\$50 par), to be offered for public sale (*at \$100 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by The First Boston Corp., 20 Exchange P1., New York. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$34,500,000 will be used to pay short-term indebtedness (incurred for construction purposes) and the balance for construction expenditures. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$131 million for 1972 and \$120 million for 1973. (File 2-43106)

THE DELTONA CORPORATION, 3250 S. W. 3rd Ave., <u>Miami, Fla.</u> 33129, filed a registration statement on February 17 seeking registration of 110,000 outstanding shares of common stock, which may be offered for sale from time to time by the holder thereof (Elliott J. Mackle) at prices current at the time of sale (*\$34.125 per share maximum). (File 2-43109)

<u>CRUTCHER RESOURCES CORPORATION</u>, 1500 Main Bldg., <u>Houston, Tex</u>. 77002, filed a registration statement on February 18 seeking registration of 100,000 outstanding shares of common stock to be offered for public sale from time to time by the holder thereof (Eugene F. Fullen) at prices current at the time of sale. (File 2-43110)

UNION ELECTRIC COMPANY, One Memorial Drive, <u>St. Louis, Mo</u>. 63166, filed a registration statement on February 18 seeking registration of 2,900,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale (*at \$20 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Lehman Brothers Inc., One William St., and Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc., 70 Pine St., both of New York. Net proceeds from its stock sale will be applied to retirement of short-term bank loans and commercial paper notes (expected to aggregate \$60 million) incurred for construction purposes. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$195 million for 1972. (File 2-43111)

<u>NABIS FINE ARTS, INC.</u>, 276 Park Avenue South, <u>New York, N. Y</u>. 10010, filed a registration statement on February 17 seeking registration of 100,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale at \$5 per share by Mendlinger, Synder, Inc., 20 Broadway, New York, N. Y. The company is engaged in the wholesale distribution of graphic art. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, up to \$175,000 will be used for expansion of the company's operations as a publisher of graphics and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes.
