<u>AMERICAN NATURAL GAS SEEKS ORDER</u>. American Natural Gas Company, <u>New York</u> registered holding company, and Michigan Consolidated Gas Company, its subsidiary, have applied to the SEC for an order under the Holding company Act authorizing American Natural Gas to acquire an additional 360,000 shares of common stock of michigan Consolidated for a total consideration of \$5,040,000. The Commission has issued an order (Release 5-15236) giving interested persons until June 4 to request a hearing thereon. Michigan Consolidated will apply the proceeds from the stock sale to its 1965 construction program, estimated to cost \$55,000,000.

<u>COASTAL CHEMICAL PROPOSES OFFERING</u>. Coastal Chemical Corporation, <u>Yazoo City</u>, <u>Miss</u>., filed a registration statement (File 2-23562) with the SEC on May 3 seeking registration of 40,000 shares of Class A common tock and 150,000 Class D common shares, to be offered for public sale at \$35 per share and \$30 per share, respectively. The offering is to be made through company employees and through Mississippi Chemical Corporation (MCC) as underwriter on a best-efforts basis. The company will reimburse MCC for any expenses incurred in the sale of stock, estimated to be 33¢ per share.

The primary purpose of the company is to provide high analysis fertilizers, anhydrous ammonia and other ertilizer materials to its stockholders. Net proceeds from its stock sale will be added to general funds of the company and used for working capital requirements and in the construction of additions to its facilities. In addition to indebtedness, the company has outstanding 418,523 Class A; 2,500,000 Class B; 102,275 Class C; and 359,366 Class D common shares. Of the outstanding stock, management officials own .86% of the Class A, .23% of Class C and .27% of Class D common shares. MCC owns all of the outstanding Class B shares, in addition to 2,748 Class A shares and 1 Class C share, constituting 74% of all voting rights of the company. eRoy P. Percy and Owen Cooper are board chairman and president, respectively, of the company and MCC.

<u>WORTHINGTON FILES STOCK PLAN</u>. Worthington Corporation, 401 Worthington Ave., <u>Harrison, N. J.</u> 07029, iiled a registration statement (File 2-23563) with the SEC on May 5 seeking registration of 17,515 shares of common stock, to be offered under the Alco-Worthington Stock Option Plan.

JAMES OLIVER WELLS CONVICTED. The SEC Seattle Regional Office announced April 30 (LR-3216) that James liver Wells (a/k/a James W. Wells) of Lynnwood, Wash., was convicted on five counts of grand larceny and 29 ounts of furnishing false information to the State of Washington Department of Licenses, following a trial n the Superior Court in King County, Seattle. The convictions were entered on an information filed by the ling County Prosecutor based upon the defendant's activities in the sale of investment contracts of American railer Owners of Washington, Inc., and Easy-Tow Rental System of Washington, Inc., both Washington corporaions controlled by Wells.

SEAWAY LIFE INS. PROPOSES OFFERING. Seaway Life Insurance Company, 845 Terrace St., <u>Muskegon, Mich.</u>, iled a registration statement (File 2-23564) with the SEC on April 26 seeking registration of 1,725,000 hares of common stock. Of this stock, 1,421,000 shares are to be offered for public sale at \$4 per share hrough Seaway Investment Company of Muskegon, Mich., which will receive a 47¢-per-share commission. The inderwriter has agreed to use its best efforts to sell not less than 421,000 shares. Seaway was organized or the sole purpose of acting as the underwriter for this offering. Of the remaining stock, 79,000 shares ave been subscribed for by incorporators of the company at \$3.53 per share, and 225,000 are to be offered ursuant to the company's Stock Option Plans.

The company is to be organized under Michigan law as a life insurance and health and accident insurance ompany. Net proceeds from its stock sale will be used in the organization and conduct of such business. ussell S. Cloetingh, Jr., president, has subscribed to 12,500 company shares. Cloetingh and four other comany officials own all of the stock of the underwriter.
