INVESTORS INTER-CONTINENTAL SEEKS ORDER. Investors Inter-Continental Fund, Ltd., 1000 Roanoke Bldg., nneapolis, Minn., has applied to the SEC for an order under the Investment Company Act declaring that it s ceased to be an investment company; and the Commission has issued an order (Release IC-4244) giving interted persons until June 1 to request a hearing thereon. The application states that on June 30, 1964, the mpany, a Canadian registered open-end diversified management investment company, was reorganized pursuant a plan approved by its shareholders and transferred its assets, liabilities and obligations to a Nevada rporation by the same name,

NEES SEEKS ORDER. New England Electric System and one of its electric utility subsidiaries, Massachusetts ectric Company, have applied to the SEC for an order under the Holding Company Act authorizing Mass. Electric sell to NEES an additional 142,857 of its common shares at \$70 per share, or for an aggregate price of ,999,990; and the Commission has issued an order (Release 35-15239) giving interested persons until June 14 request a hearing thereon. According to the application, Mass. Electric will apply the proceeds from its tock sale to the repayment . \$11,500,000 of indebtedness to NEES incurred for construction purposes.

ACTION IN CONTINENTAL GROWTH FUND CONCLUDED. The SEC New York Regional Office announced May 7 (LR-3219) at the injunctive action filed in July 1963 against Continental Growth Fund, Inc., and certain individuals s been concluded as to all defendants. In December 1964 the court-appointed receiver, with court approval, ansferred the Fund's assets to National Investors Corp., and Fund shareholders exchanged their stock for ares of that company.

COMPLAINT CITES ERLING C. OLSEN. The SEC New York Regional Office announced May 10 (LR-3220) the filing a complaint (USDC SDNY) seeking to enjoin Erling C. Olsen, d/b/a Fitch Investors Service, 129 Front St., w York, from further violations of the reporting, bookkeeping and anti-fraud provisions of the Federal curities laws. The Commission is also seeking an order requiring Olsen to produce his books and records or inspection by SEC representatives.

I.C.S. ASSOCIATES FILES FOR OFFERING. I.C.S. Associates, Inc. (to be known as Investors Planning Corporation of America), 60 E. 42nd St., New York 10017, depositor for Single Payment Investment Plans, Systematic evestment Plans and Systematic Investment Plans with Insurance for the Accumulation of Shares of Axe Science propration, filed a registration statement (File 2-23580) with the SEC on May 10 seeking registration of 500,000 of single payment plans and \$3,000,000 of systematic payment plans for the accumulation of shares of ke Science Corp.

Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation, Southern National ank Bldg., Houston, Tex., filed a registration statement (File 2-23582) with the SEC on May 12 seeking regstration of \$15,000,000 of interests of participants in its Employees' Stock Purchase Plan, together with 10,000 shares of common stock that may be acquired pursuant thereto.

HATTERAS YACHT PROPOSES OFFERING. Hatteras Yacht Company, 2200 Kivett Dr., High Point, N. C., filed a egistration statement (File 2-23583) with the SEC on May 12 seeking registration of 250,000 shares of common tock, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Powell, Kistler & Co., 110 Old Sc., Myetteville, N. C. The public offering price (\$4.50 per share maximum*) and underwriting terms are to be upplied by amendment.

The company is engaged in the business of manufacturing yachts designed for off-shore fishing and boating relatively rough waters, such as those around Cape Hatteras, N. C. Of the net proceeds from its stock le, \$150,000 will be used for new tooling and the balance will be added to working capital, which will be vailable to retire indebtedness. In addition to indebtedness, the company has outstanding 845,325 common hares, of which management officials own approximately 55%. Earl Norfleet Phillips is board chairman and Illis Howard Slane, Jr., is president.

CONGRESSIONAL LIFE PROPOSES OFFERING. Congressional Life Insurance Company, 350 Fifth Ave., New York 0001, filed a registration statement (File 2-23584) with the SEC on May 12 seeking registration of 950,000 hares of capital stock. Of this stock, 310,000 shares are to be offered for public sale through underwriters aded by Lee Higginson Corp., 2C Broad St., New York 10005, (150,000 initially to persons designated by the empany). Organized under New York law in February 1965, the company intends to engage in writing life insurance an the State of New York. Net proceeds from its stock sale will be used to meet organizational expenses of the company and in the conduct of its business. Bernard M. Eiber is president.
