
Multiple-fatality incidents are defined as single incidents in which two or more workers were fatally injured. In 2005, 466 workers, representing 8 percent of all fatal work injuries, were killed in multiple-fatality incidents.

Transportation incidents accounted for 64 percent of the workers killed in multiple-fatality incidents. Fatal injuries resulting from homicides accounted for another 17 percent of these fatalities.
