Irwin Army Community Hospital (IACH):

IACH opens new mTBI clinic on Custer Hill

Irwin Army Community Hospital hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony for a new mild traumatic brain injury (mTBI) clinic Sept. 30 at Building 7606 on Custer Hill. Patients treated at this clinic have mTBI, essentially concussive injuries, termed one of the signature wounds of the Irag and Afghanistan wars. The design of the new clinic provides physical therapy, occupational therapy, behavioral health treatment and other medical care specific to rehabilitation of these injuries. This clinic environment facilitates multi-disciplinary treatment leading Soldiers toward a full recovery. For additional information call the mTBI clinic at 239-1476.

You're being referred to the civilian network, but now what?

You have several options for managing your referral.

Before you leave the hospital, you can walk in to the Referral Management Center on the 5th Floor to schedule specialty care appointments. If you are unable to walk in, you can still call 239-DOCS (3627) or 1-888-239-DOCS (3627) within three days for assistance. The Referral Management Center is open 7:30am to 6pm Monday through Friday. We're here to help you.

Appointment cancellation

Missed appointments negatively affect overall access to care. Please honor your appointment times and keep us informed of unexpected circumstances that require rescheduling, so our time can be focused on serving you. Cancellations should be done 48 to 72 hours prior to the appointment whenever possible.

You have several options to cancel an appointment:

- Call the appointment cancellation line at 239-8428. You will be asked to leave a message including your full name, sponsor's social security number last four digits, and the appointment time and date. Please provide full information to ensure your appointment is canceled properly.
- Respond appropriately to the automated Patient Appointment Reminder System. PARS will call you three days prior to your scheduled appointment with a reminder. It will prompt you to make a selection to keep or cancel the appointment.

MyCAA (Military Spouse Career Advancement Account) Updates:

The program will resume October 25, 2010. You must contact a Military OneSource Career and Education Counselor at www.militaryonesource.com.

Eligibility requirements include:

- The MyCAA program will revert back to their original intent, which was to focus on portable career fields, such as, real estate licenses, home health care accreditations, cosmetology, and child care providers, etc.
- Spouses of junior grade personnel: pay grades of E1-E5, W1-W2, and O1-O2. Soldier must be on active duty status at the time the spouse uses the benefits.
- Offer a maximum financial benefit of \$4,000 with a fiscal cap of \$2,000. Waivers will be available for spouses pursuing licensure or certification up to the maximum assistance of \$4,000.
- Requires the spouse to finish their program of study within three years from the start date of the first course.
- Be limited to Associates degrees, certifications, and licensures.
- No grandfather clause for those individuals who have been in the program. They will have to abide by military grade restrictions and the \$4K cap.

Leader Skills Enhancement Courses (LSEC):

LSEC is designed to assist in the training of Noncommissioned Officers and Soldiers demonstrating leadership potential in the advanced skills needed to perform at higher-level leadership and staff positions. ALL Soldiers must enroll in GOARMYED (https://www.goarmyed.com/Login.aspx).

https://www.acapexpress.army.mil or by calling 785-239-2278. Briefings are held Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday at 9:00am and 1:00pm. Soldiers reporting for their initial Pre-separation Briefing without a valid AKO account/password and/or arriving late will be rescheduled.

- You may start the ACAP process up to 12 months prior to separation for ETSing Soldiers and up to 24 months prior to anticipated retirement date for Retiring Soldiers. In no event should the process begin later than 90 days prior to separation. All Soldiers regardless of reason being separated are required to complete this briefing. You do not need orders to begin the ACAP process. ACAP is here to assist Soldiers in determining whether to "get out" or "stay in".
- In addition to the Pre-separation Briefing, all Soldiers are required to attend a 4-hour VA Benefits Briefing prior to separating. This briefing is held Thursdays 9:00am-2:00pm. For those Soldiers injured while in service or want more information on the Vocational Rehabilitation program are welcome to attend the DTAP VA Briefing, Thursdays 2:00-4:00pm.
