### **Why This Matters**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Recovery Act) appropriated \$1 billion to the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) for buying and installing screening equipment at airports. This is one of a series of audits that we are performing to help ensure that Recovery Act funds were used for authorized purposes.

The objective of this audit was to determine whether costs invoiced by the Omaha Airport Authority for design and installation of closed-circuit television cameras at the Omaha Eppley Airfield Airport were allowable, allocable, and reasonable.

## Costs Invoiced by the Omaha Airport Authority for Closed-Circuit Television Cameras at Omaha Eppley Airfield Airport

### What We Determined

We determined that costs of \$3,562,994 invoiced for the design and installation of closed-circuit television cameras at Omaha Eppley Airfield Airport were allowable, allocable, and reasonable. In addition, we verified that the Omaha Airport Authority submitted to the Federal Government the required quarterly reports on project activities and complied with the Recovery Act requirements for paying prevailing wages. The report did not contain any recommendations.
