Colonel Charles E. A. Sexton enlisted in the Army Infantry as a Private. He was then selected as brigade executive officer 1st Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division. His assignment ended as the Inspector General for Fort Riley and the 24th Infantry Division. Lt Col Sexton was selected to command 1st Battalion, 36th Infantry, 1st Armored Division in Friedberg, Germany, and deployed to Irag in Operation Iragi Freedom. His assignment in Germany culminated on the U.S. Army Europe Staff. He has served on the Department of the Army Staff as a strategic planner for both the Army and the Joint Staff.
