

Science.gov: 50 Databases, 2100 Websites in One Place

Fort Belvoir, VA – Science.gov (<u>www.science.gov</u>) provides access to U. S. government science information and research. An interagency initiative, the Defense Technical Information Center (DTIC) is one of 17 U.S. government organizations from 13 federal agencies that govern Science.gov as part of the Science.gov Alliance.

Since being launched in December 2002, Science.gov has grown to provide a search of over 50 scientific databases, 200 million pages of science information from over 2,100 websites with one query. The site also provides a variety of features including clustering of results by subtopics, authors or dates; option to email results; Aggregated Science News Feed; and an image search.

Science.gov provides authoritative information. This information is not collected using web crawls and spiders, but is selected by agency information managers and librarians. The content contains results from government-funded research and development (R&D).

With single search capability, DTIC MultiSearch allows users to query more than 400 resources contained in over 50 websites including Science.gov. http://multisearch.deepwebaccess.com/multisearch/.
