EISENHOWER LEADERSHIP PATCH, Boy Scout Level:

KNOWLEDGE:

1. *At Ease: Stories I Tell to Friends* by Dwight D. Eisenhower. Pages 182 – 195 cover Eisenhower's adventures in Panama, under the mentorship of General Fox Conner, and pages 198 – 203 recount Eisenhower's Command and General Staff School experience at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.
