EISENHOWER LEADERSHIP PATCH, Cub Scout Level:

HONESTY:

1. *At Ease: Stories I Tell to Friends* by Dwight D. Eisenhower. Chapters 4 – 7 contain many passages that would be appropriate for exploring Eisenhower's boyhood years and the development of the character trait of "honesty."
