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GTR Policy Approach

- Policy
 - PERFORMANCE-BASED
 - Regulating the performance rather than the design of vehicles and their components
 - SCIENCE-BASED and DATA-DRIVEN
 - Rulemakings are undertaken only when grounded in theory and backed by sound, empirical evidence.
- GTRs must:
 - Meet a safety need
 - Be technologically and economically practicable
 - Have objective test procedures
 - Be performance-oriented (vs. design restrictive)
 - Be appropriate for each vehicle type



NHTSA and the Pedestrian GTR

- The technical requirements of this GTR are based on the tests developed in the IHRA Pedestrian Working Group, in which NHTSA was an active participant
- NHTSA was an active participant in the informal working group to ensure the requirements were technically feasible and cost effective.
 - Conducted validation testing of the procedures and analyzed the impact on a range of vehicles
 - Evaluated countermeasures



Next Steps

- Finalize the cost-benefits evaluation for the head and leg tests
- Federalize the head and leg impactors
- Initiate the rulemaking process of the GTR
