Overview of SCI

- Examines safety impact of rapidly changing technologies
- Provide the Agency with early detection of alleged or potential vehicle defects
- Types of cases investigated include:
 - Certified Advanced Compliant Air Bag cases
 - School Bus Crashworthiness Investigations
 - Vehicles with Adaptive Vehicle Controls
 - Not In Traffic cases
 - Other vehicle safety issues as requested by the Agency



Not in Traffic Case Types

- Seeking incidents in the following areas:
 - Back Over
 - Backing light passenger vehicle strikes a person from the rear or approaching from the side
 - NHTSA focus is children
 - Window entrapment
 - Child strangled in a window
 - Hyper/Hypothermia
 - Children left unattended in cold / hot vehicles
 - Trunk entrapment
 - Children getting locked in a vehicle trunk
 - Rollaway
 - Vehicle slips out of gear and injures a non occupant
 - Carbon monoxide poisoning
 - Others as identified

Investigations Breakdown

• Of the 71 Published Cases:

•	Back Over	56
•	Hyperthermia	8
•	Power Window Entrapment	3
•	Trunk Entrapment	2
•	Roll away	2



Back Over Breakdown Vehicles Involved

- 56 Back Over cases comprising:
 - 18 Passenger cars
 - 25 Sport Utility Vehicles or Vans
 - 13 Pickup Trucks









Back Over Breakdown

Ages

Of the 56 Back Over Cases:

•	Involved children		50 *
	· <1	1	
	· 1 - 3	34	
	. 4 - 8	13	
	• 9 - 13	2	
•	Persons > 13		8
•	Unknown		0

- * Two cases involved two children ages 2, 4, 8 and 9
- Focus of the Back Over cases is children, however some adults are included if seriously injured or the presence of an OEM (or post-OEM) backing or parking aid



Back Over Breakdown Severity

- Of the 56 Back Over Cases:
 - Fatal Outcome 28
 - Non-Fatal 26 (moderate to severe injuries)
 - Unknown4


Note: two case involved two children – two fatal and two non-fatal



Back Over Breakdown Victim Path

Of the 56 Back Over Cases:

- 41 are approaching from right or left of vehicle
- 10 are stationary (or close to stationary) behind the vehicle, playing behind, etc.
- 3 unknown path
- 2 Others (riding in hatch, running up to vehicle from behind and fell)
