The TREAD Act Covers Four Major Areas

- Tires
- Child Passenger Safety
- Rollover
- Defects/Recalls

Defect Provisions - Penalties

- Civil Penalties
- --Criminal Penalties

Recall Provisions

- Extension of Periods for Free Remedies
- Acceleration of Manufacturer's Remedy Program
- Reimbursement of Costs Incurred by a
 Consumer Before a Recall
- Prohibition of Sale of Recalled Tires and Other Equipment
- Notice to NHTSA of Such Prohibited Sales
- Disposition of Recalled Tires

Early Warning - Basic Provisions

Manufacturers to report foreign and domestic:

- Claims regarding serious injuries or death
- Aggregate statistical data on property damage
- Consumer satisfaction campaigns, etc.
- Incidents involving fatalities and serious injuries allegedly due to defects

Early Warning - Basic Provisions (cont.)

- Regulations <u>may</u> require reporting of other data
- Regulations must specify how data will be used by NHTSA
- Requirements may not be unduly burdensome

Early Warning - Basic Provisions (cont.)

- NHTSA can only require submission of information in manufacturer's possession
- Disclosure of information
- Periodic review

Early Warning - Process and Timing

- ANPRM: January 2001
- NPRM: December 2001
 - Comments Closed: February 4, 2002
- Statutory Deadline: June 30, 2002

Early Warning - Major Issues

- Mho must report information?
- Spetroder ed principal supplied in Musicipal Supplied in Suppli
- Will different types of manufacturers be treated differently?
- When and how often should information be reported?

Early Warning - Major Issues (cont.)

- What burdens would be "undue?"
- □ How will data be submitted?
- How will NHTSA utilize and store the data?
- What data will be available to the public?

All Vehicle Mfrs and All Original & Replacement Equipment Mfrs Must Provide:



Most Extensive Requirements Apply to Larger Vehicle Mirs (over 500 vehicles sold in the U.S.), Tire Mirs, and Child Restraint Mirs.

ISSUES

- Definitions (e.g., "manufacturer," "claim," "serious injury," warranty")
- Threshold for reporting property damage claims
- Consumer complaints
- Alleged overlapping of certain system/component categories
- Submission of field reports

ISSUES

- "Substantially similar" vehicles and equipment for foreign reporting
- Whether to require updating/correcting of reports of an incident
- Redaction responsibility
- Date that first reports will be due
- Form in which data will be submitted
- One-time reporting of historical data
