NON-PARTY CATERPILLAR INC.'S MOTION TO SET SCHEDULE FOR THE FILING OF ITS MOTION FOR IN CAMERA TREATMENT OF PROPOSED TRIAL EXHIBITS

Caterpillar Inc. ("Caterpillar"), which is not a party to the above-captioned matter, respectfully requests this Court to grant its Motion to set a schedule for the filing of a motion for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits which Caterpillar recently learned are to be offered by Respondents as evidence in the hearing of the above matter.

BACKGROUND

1. On March 13, 2012, Respondent OFS Healthcare System sent Caterpillar a letter via regular U.S. mail providing notice to Caterpillar of Respondent's intent to offer confidential materials as evidence in this matter which Caterpillar produced in response to a Subpoena *Duces Tecum* ("notice letter"). Caterpillar did not receive Respondent's notice letter until March 19, 2012.

2. The *Code of Federal Regulations*, 16 C.F.R. § 3.45 (1999), provides that a third party be given "at least 10 days notice of the proposed use of such material." Accordingly, by regulation, Caterpillar's response would not be due until March 29.

3. The Scheduling Order in this matter sets the deadline for filing motions for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits for March 20, 2012. However, Caterpillar was not

aware of this order, as it is not a party, until the FTC provided it with a copy on March 21, 2012. Caterpillar is filing the present motion to clarify when its motion for *in camera* treatment should be filed.

4. Caterpillar has retained outside counsel in this matter as expeditiously as possible in order to file this motion and a motion for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits. Caterpillar asks that it permitted to file its motion for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits ten days after receipt of the notice letter, to and including March 29, 2012.

5. Caterpillar is not filing this motion for purposes of delay, and the granting of this motion will not prejudice Respondents.

WHEREFORE, for all the foregoing reasons, Non-Party Caterpillar Inc. respectfully requests this Court to set the time for Caterpillar to file its motions for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits to and including March 29, 2012.
