Community/Neighborhood Analysis Workshop

A half-day program aimed at those persons whose main interest is in small or sub-city areas such as tracts, block groups, blocks, etc. It provides experience in analyzing census geography, locating data for small areas and preparing small area demographic profiles.

Census on the Net

This half-day workshop provides an in-depth look at the Census Bureau website, www.census.gov. It will describe the kinds of census data available on the Internet and demonstrate how to access the information using interactive tools, including *American FactFinder*.

Accessing American Indian Data

This half-day workshop provides practical experience in using small area data and Census maps in developing both reservation and community profiles. It emphasizes Census data products for American Indians.

Using Census Data for Grant Writing

This half-day workshop is designed to provide general information about the use of census data in Federal fund distribution. The class participants will be introduced to the importance of 2010 census data & American Community Survey.



How Small Business Can Profit from Census Data

The power to use and to analyze census data is now available to more small businesses than ever. Data from the Census Bureau provides indispensable information to the owner of a small business. This seminar will cover a variety of topics to help small businesses understand their customer, their competitor, and the changing market place.

Understanding Race and Hispanic Origin Data

This session explains how data on race and Hispanic or Latino origin were collected in 2010 Census and American Community Survey. It reviews various data products which present data on race and ethnicity. Population changes will also be discussed.

Exploring and Understanding Socio-economic Census Data

This three hour workshop explains accessing socio-economic census data from American FactFinder and the American Community Survey. Subjects include; income, poverty, education, labor force, disability, language spoken, migration, journey to work, and housing.

Using Economic Statistics Workshop

This half-day workshop will feature information from the Economic Census, Quarterly Workforce Indicators & Industry Focus. Major topics include Census of Retail Trade, Service Industries, Manufacturing, and Minorityowned Businesses.

Fundamentals of Aging

This workshop is for planners, analysts, administrators and others who need data on the aging population and information by specific age groups.

How to Find the Data You Need

This full day computer workshop will provide information for understanding, locating, and using the latest 2010 Census data, Economic Census data and many other data sources. Through exercises and hands-on demos, participants will improve their skills in using www.census.gov and the new American FactFinder system.

Youth Population Dynamics

This half day program provides a comprehensive review of 2010 Census data on children. A broad array of census data and its sources available through www.census.gov are covered.

We recommend this workshop for data analysts, planners, service providers, researchers, non-profit groups and others whose special focus is children.

Making the Most of American FactFinder

This three hour workshop on *American FactFinder 2* provides a dynamic resource on the census website that will help you locate 2010 Census data quickly. It's the primary tool for retrieving reports, creating tables and generating thematic maps from 2010 Census & American Community Survey.

Using Census Data and GIS

This workshop provides introductory information on integrating 2010 Census data into geographic information systems (GIS). It reviews the components of the Census Bureau Tiger GIS system, demonstrates practical uses of Tiger and provides information on 2010 Census data products and how these can be used with GIS products for thematic mapping, geocoding, and other spatial uses.
