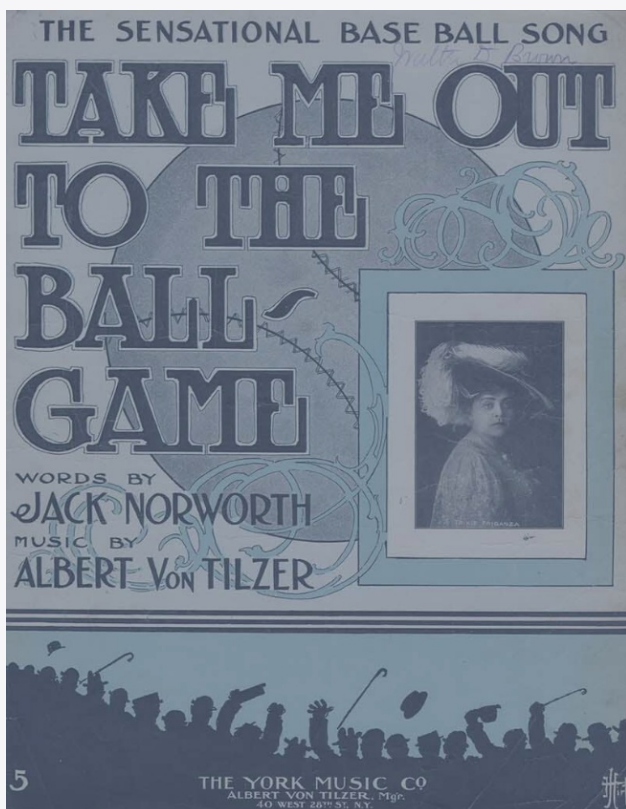

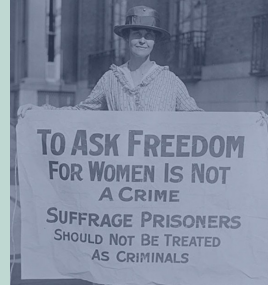

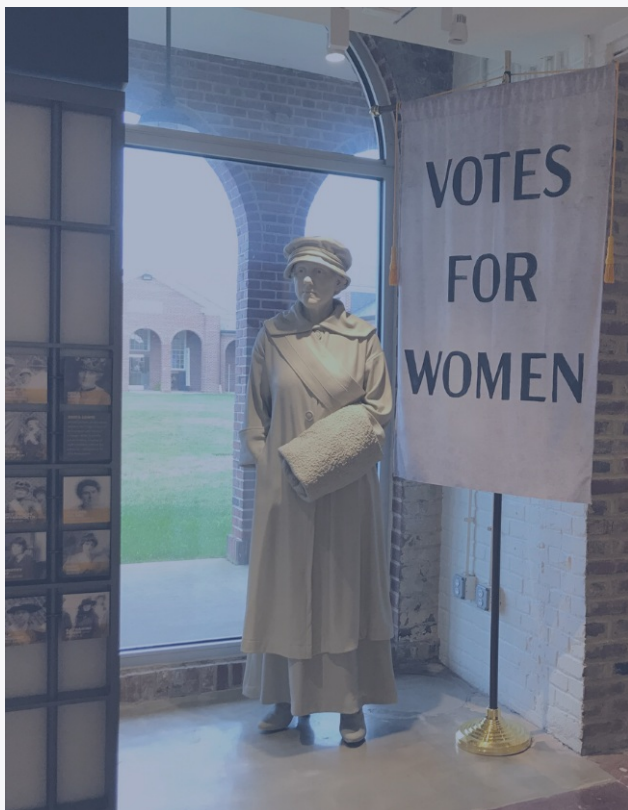
## Herstory Lesson: The Night of Terror

## SUFFRAGE STATUES



The WSCC is loaning statues of suffragists Alice Paul, Mary Church Terrell, and Carrie Chapman Catt to the **Turning Point Suffragist Memorial**, a national memorial dedicated to the women who waged and won the fight for women's right to vote, opening on August 26, 2020. The WSCC is also loaning statues of suffragists Lucy Burns and Dora Lewis to the **Lucy Burns Museum**, a newly renovated gallery which shares the story of the 72 suffragists who were detained at the Occoquan Workhouse. The WSCC is proud to partner with these two historical sites to support the telling of this critical piece of suffrage history.
