Skydiving in Seneca Falls



In partnership with the WSCC, the [Highlight Pro Skydiving Team](#), an all-female demonstration team led by renowned professional skydivers, performed an aerial skydiving display in Seneca Falls, New York on July 18. The skydivers landed on the lawn next to the National Women's Hall of Fame and just across the river from the Women's Rights National Historical Park. The event commemorated the centennial of the 19th Amendment on the anniversary of the first Woman's Rights Convention in Seneca Falls in 1848. The Highlight Pro Skydiving Team will perform similar centennial jumps in the coming weeks, including in [Nashville, TN](#) on August 18, in Valley Forge, PA on August 25, and New York City, NY on August 26.

PRX announced two new history-driven podcasts inspired by the courageous suffragists who worked to secure the right to vote for American women.

The podcasts will premiere on Wednesday, August 5. New episodes will be released weekly through September 16, featuring the untold stories of the women's suffrage movement and the generations of activists who championed equality. In *And Nothing Less: The Untold Stories of Women's Fight for the Vote* actresses Rosario Dawson and Retta will guide listeners through stories not often found in history books. *The Magic Sash*, hosted by gold medal gymnast and advocate Aly Raisman, is a historical fiction adventure for tweens in which an 11-year-old girl and boy journey back in time to meet iconic suffragists.


