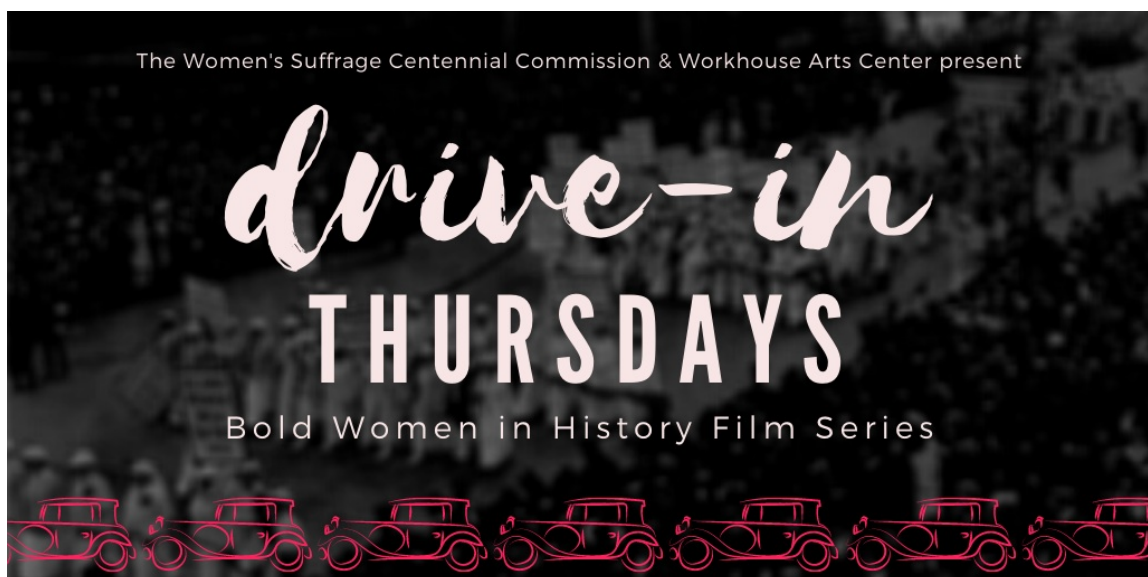
Live from Nashville: Song Suffragettes

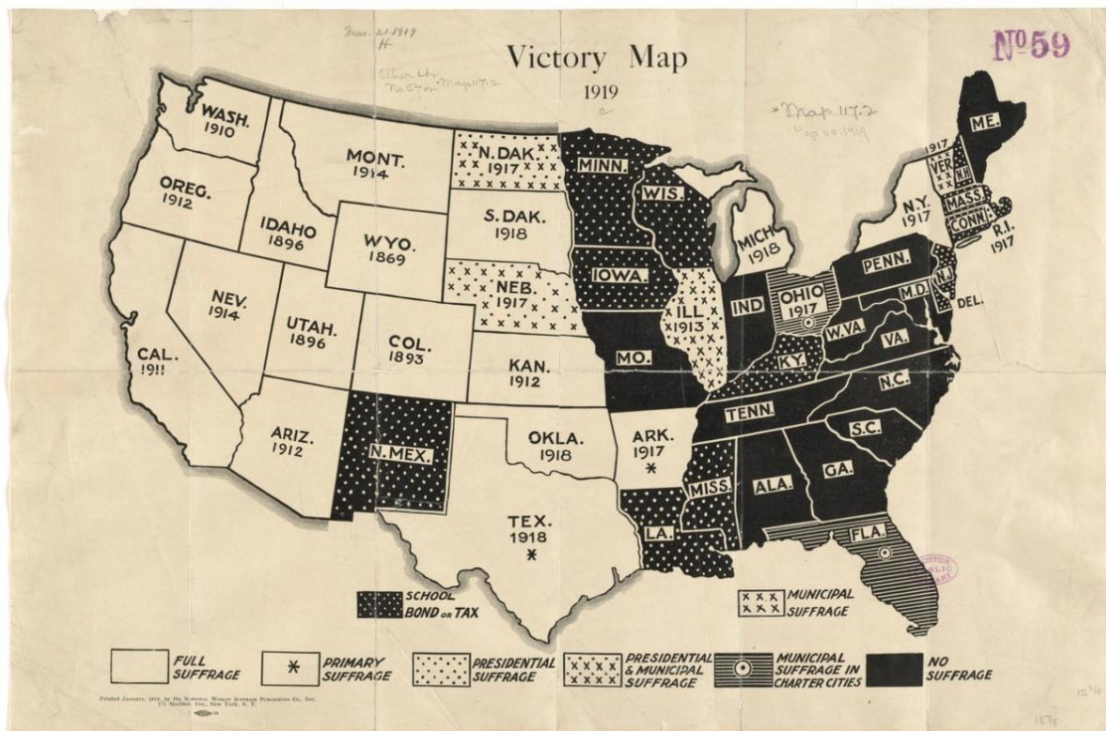
