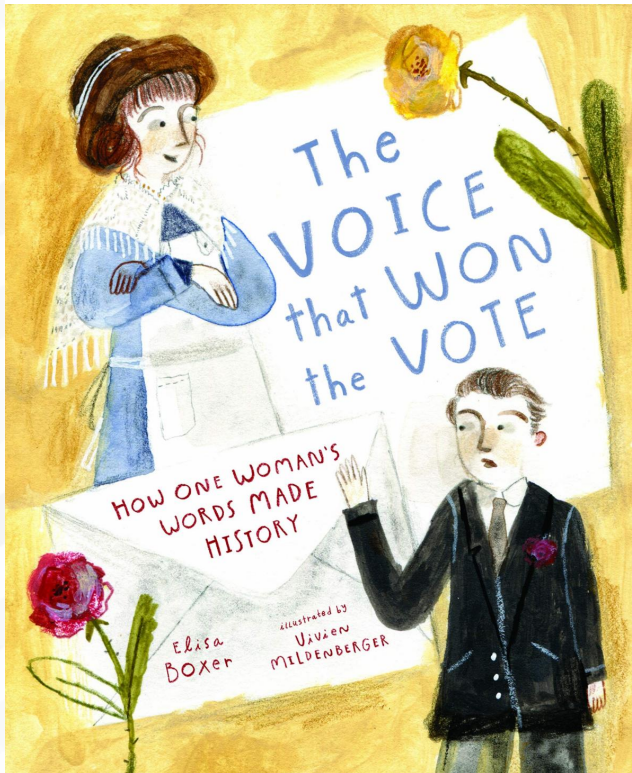

Jeannette Rankin: One Woman, One Vote

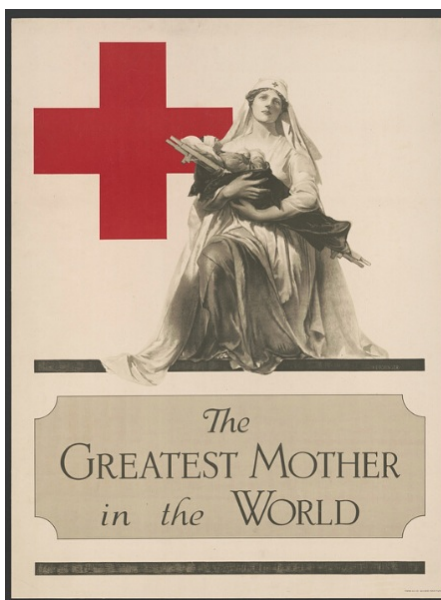

Nurses Week


