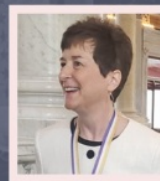

In October 1909, Emmeline Pankhurst spoke to a standing-room-only group of women packed into Carnegie Hall in New York. Hundreds more had gathered outside to hear the famous "suffragette" speak about the fight to win the vote for British women. Although Pankhurst's tactics were often discredited in the United States as too militant, the British suffrage movement was very influential on the American suffrage movement. 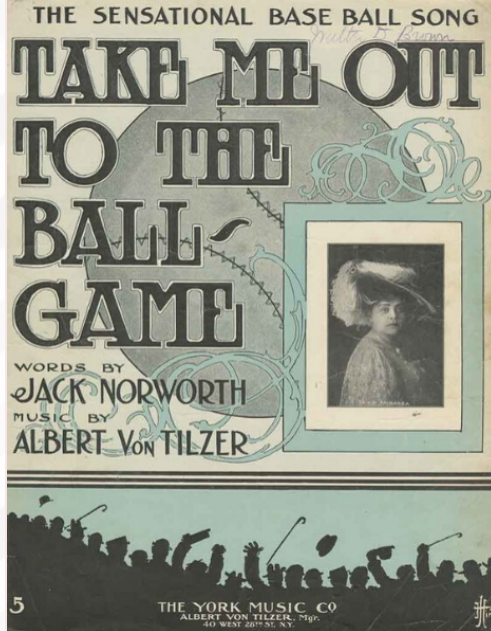
Rightfully Hers Pop-Up Exhibit
